
Site Steward Program

- Active stewards now total 229.
- 674% increase since program inception.
- 54 new stewards in last 6 months.



Site Steward Program

- Stewards logged
 5,100 hours in 2005 –
 36 major impacts and
 12 lesser impacts
 reported.
- 10 training classes in 2006. Enrollments exceeding capacity.
- Statewide program now underway.


- 160,000 volunteer hours.


WATCH YOUR STEP.
