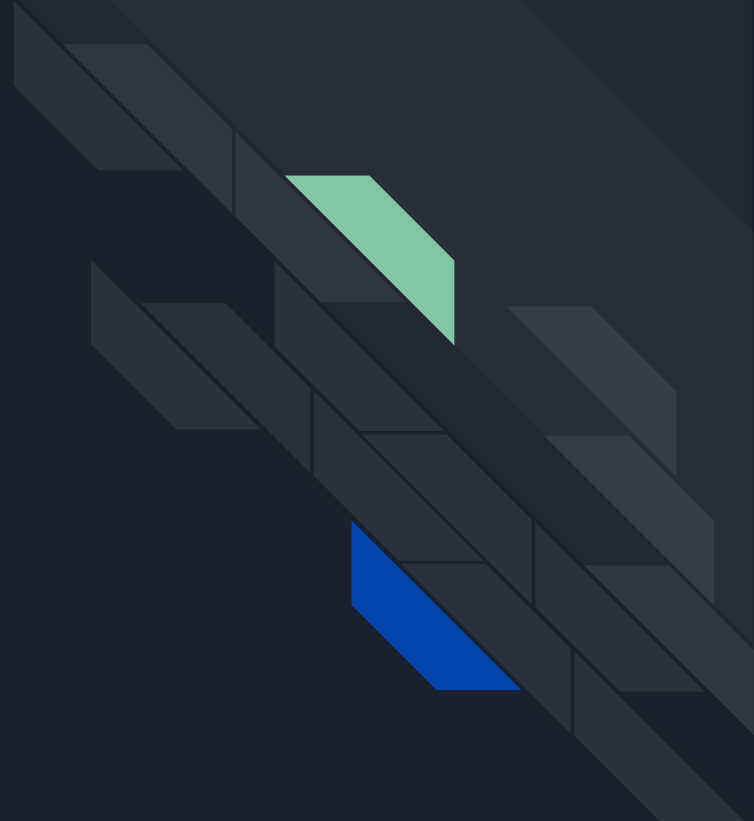

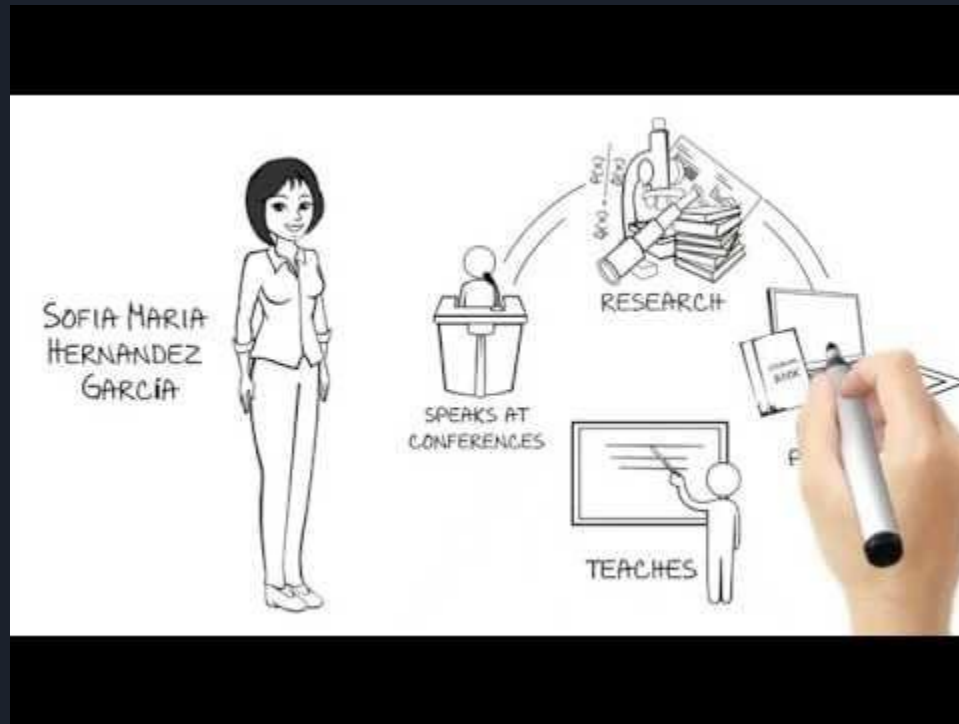

# ORCID and You

## “Why should I get an ORCID iD?”

- **Publishers and funders require them**
- Assert authorship over works
- Minimize data entry in publication and grant application workflows
- Improve work discoverability
- **Name disambiguation**
- Grants, scholarship, peer review, and other projects all in one place

## Getting the most out of ORCID

- Connect with publishers, funding agencies, and others
- Fill in your researcher bio, keywords, and preferred name
- ***Use it!***

- When you attempt to register you may be prompted with accounts that may be yours. Check and see!
- If you can't remember your password, perform a password reset.
- You can merge accounts if you end up with more than one (but try not to!)

# One Point One: Accounts and Settings

## Customizable Privacy Options



Everyone: publicly visible through the orcid.org site or the API.



Trusted parties: visible only to organizations or individuals you have given permission to access your record.



Only me: fully private, even through the API.

## Enter Only What You Want

- biography
- education
- employment
- keywords
- alternate names
- preferred name
- website(s)
- email addresses

## Display Only What You Want

All information in your ORCID record can be set to any of the three privacy levels, down to individual works.

- CrossRef Metadata Search
- DataCite
- MLA International Bibliography

And more!

Required: **Work Category**, **Work Type**, and **Title**



# Two Point One: Trusted Parties

## What's a **Trusted Party**?

- An organization or individual you've granted access to your record
- Can view "public" or "limited" information: *not* "private"
- Each organization lists which permissions they're requesting





## Why Grant Access?

- Auto-populate your record
- Assert and verify affiliations

## Okay, But...

Revoke Trusted Party status at any time, just like changing a privacy setting: use the **Account Settings** page to view Trusted Parties (organizations and individuals)

## Two Point Two: Nifty ORCID Tricks

- Import a BibTeX file
  - from Google Scholar
- Grant someone else access to your profile
  - Take it away again
- Sign in with your gmail-managed .edu address (we checked: this works)
- Export citations in BibTeX
  - Import them into other systems
- Use your ORCID iD as a search criterion (CrossRef, PubMed)
- Connect with ImpactStory, Scopus, Publons
- Add it to your [email signature](#)
