As Vice President for Education and Training at the National Wildlife Federation, Kevin Coyle is responsible for Campus Ecology, Climate Classroom, climate training for adults leaders, and the Federation's award-winning children's magazines. Prior to joining NWF, Mr. Coyle was President of the National Environmental Education & Training Foundation and also previously served as President of American Rivers, the nation's principal river conservation organization. Early in his career, Mr. Coyle spent 10 years at the U.S. Department of the Interior, where he was Assistant Regional Director for State and Local Programs for the National Park Service's Northeast Office. There he directed the Land and Water Conservation Fund Grants program and natural resource planning programs. In August 2008, the National Wildlife Federation issued A National Report Card on Sustainability in Higher Education. This comprehensive study, conducted annually since 2001 by NWF and Princeton Survey Research Associates International, reviews trends and new developments in environmental performance and sustainability at 1,068 institutions. The report analyzes collective trends in areas of management, operations, and academics.
