## Refugee Arrivals in the Mountain West, 2017-2021

Demography Fact Sheet No. 19 | September 2021

### PURPOSE:

This fact sheet displays data on the influx of refugee arrivals by nation to five Mountain West States: Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, New Mexico, and Utah. Refugee Processing Center data, selected from annual reports and limited to the years 2017-2021, are presented.<sup>1</sup>

### ABOUT THE DATA:

The U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Population, Refugees and Migration (PRM) refugee case management systems report refugee arrivals for each fiscal year. The RPC Office of Admissions reports the annual refugee arrivals by state and nation from 2010-2020. This factsheet analyzes data from the years 2017-2021. The annual fiscal year (FY) reports date from October 1<sup>st</sup> - September 30<sup>th</sup> of each year. Special Immigrant Visa (SIV) recipients who have elected and received U.S. Refugee Admissions Program (USRAP) Reception and Placement (R&P) benefits are not included in this report.

For this fact sheet, the most current data available at the time of publication for 2021 represent only nine months, from October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020–July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021.<sup>2</sup>

### KEY FINDINGS:

1. Among Mountain West states, New Mexico accepts the least total number of refugees each year. Arizona accepts the greatest number of refugees.
2. The most refugee arrivals in Arizona, Nevada, New Mexico, and Utah for 2017-2020 are from the Democratic Republic of Congo.
3. In the FY 2020 annual report the state rankings for the number of refugees accepted among Mountain West states are: Arizona (9<sup>th</sup>), Colorado (22<sup>nd</sup>), Utah (24<sup>th</sup>), Nevada (31<sup>st</sup>), and New Mexico (40<sup>th</sup>).

Table 1 displays refugee arrivals from 2017-2020 in five Mountain West states: Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, New Mexico, and Utah. The 2021 refugee arrivals in each state represent a partial year (October 1, 2020-July 31, 2021). Arizona accepts the most refugee arrivals among the Mountain West states. Colorado receives the second largest influx of refugee arrivals, Utah is third, and Nevada is fourth. New Mexico accepts the least total number of refugees each year among Mountain West states.

Table 2 displays the top 5 nations for refugee arrivals for FY 2017 in five Mountain West states: Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, New Mexico, and Utah. Nevada lists six nations because of the same number of refugee arrivals from Eritrea and Somalia. The most refugee arrivals for Arizona, Nevada, New Mexico, and Utah are from the Democratic Republic of Congo. Most of Colorado’s refugees arrived from Somalia.

Table 5 displays the top 5 nationalities of the refugee arrivals for FY 2020 in five Mountain West states: Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, New Mexico, and Utah. Arizona shows six nationalities because of the same number of refugee arrivals from Iraq and Syria. New Mexico accepted refugees from two nations, the Democratic Republic of Congo, and the Central African Republic. The most refugee arrivals for Arizona, Nevada, New Mexico, and Utah are from the Democratic Republic of Congo. Burma provided the highest number of refugee arrivals in Colorado.

Table 6 displays the top 5 nations for refugee arrivals for FY 2021 in five Mountain West states: Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, New Mexico, and Utah. Data for FY 2021 represents a partial year, **October 1\*, 2020, through July 31\*, 2021**. Arizona shows six nationalities because of the same number of refugee arrivals from Iraq and Syria. New Mexico accepted refugees from two nations, the Democratic Republic of Congo, and the Central African Republic. The most refugee arrivals for Arizona, Nevada, New Mexico, and Utah came from the Democratic Republic of Congo. Most of Colorado’s refugee arrivals travelled from Burma.
