Gender performances -- Masculine Jasper/Feminine Lapis Lazuli

<u>Hierarchies/hegemonies</u> -- The societal hegemonies and social hierarchies of their position and powers.

1. <u>Identify the toxic and abusive behavior belonging to the characters and relationship.</u>





2. <u>Identify the symbolic nature of their relationship and how</u> the other characters' reactions give perspective to the nature of their relationship.

## The Results







#### **Key Findings**

- Jasper's behavior is noted as being wrong multiple times, in various ways.
- Lapis' behavior is called into question, despite her seemingly good intentions.
- The relationship is noted as being unstable, and is an active concern for the main characters.

Significance

- The toxic nature of Lapis and Jasper relationships is communicated to the audience as something bad.
