Black school teacher. Born in Colorado in 1905 and raised in Iowa, Mabel head off to college at the age of seventeen. She decided to attend Teachers College i Nashville, TN. Here she experienced the cruelty of Southern racism when she v harshly rebuked to move to the back of a public bus. The memory of this indigni would fuel her commitment to community activism. Mabel completed her colleg degree at Bluefield State Teachers' College in West Virginia graduating *cum lau* She then worked as a school principal in West Virginia before taking a position i the local Public Housing Office.

After the end of World War II, Mabel stopped at Las Vegas to visit family while of her way to accept a governmental position in California. Family and friends persuaded her to stay in Las Vegas and in 1946 Mabel became Las Vegas' first Black teacher at the city's all-black Westside School. Mabel is recognized for he educational leadership and role in uplifting the underserved children of the Westside School. Her educational service and community activism garnered hip praise from many esteemed organizations, including the NAACP, American Rec Cross, Zion Methodist Church, and the Wesleyan Service Guild. The University Nevada Las Vegas honored her lifetime achievements with the Distinguished Nevadan Award.
