Thank you for your interest in my research. Please forgive how long it has taken me to respond to your request. I recently transitioned from the University of New Mexico (UNM) to the University of Nevada, Reno. I have my UNM account forwarding to a gmail account which I do not regularly check. Hence the length of time it took me to respond.

In any case, I have not published a trust specific article yet. We do have an article in press with the Journal of Mixed Methods Research (JMMR) that includes the trust typology. I have also revised the dissertation version of the typology based on the dissertation research outcomes. This revised version is part of a toolkit for community-academic partners working to reduce American Indian Health inequities. The toolkit is part of a NARCH grant. My partners are the National Congress of American Indians Policy Research Center. I don't have the files with me but tomorrow I will send you the draft JMMR manuscript and the draft trust chapter of the toolkit. I also authored a book chapter on trust in community academic partnerships but its not a peer reviewed publication. Let me know if you want it anyway. In addition, I did present the typology an the American Public Health Association meeting (2 meetings ago) so that's cite-able.

Dear Dr. Lucero:

I am a Clemson University's research assistant professor, from the Dominican Republic, currently working in developing a funded research agenda on CBPR and health disparities reduction among US Hispanics. I am currently working in submitting a grant application to conduct a qualitative study on perceptions of trust among Hispanic immigrant families who are actively participating in a culturally and linguistically adapted health preventative program (PASOs) in SC. This pilot project, if approved, will be developed in the context of the Community Engaged Research Scholars program at MUSC. The purpose of this scholars program is to nurture a community-academic partnership between myself and the PASOs executive director. Results from this study will be used to support a more comprehensive R21 NIH grant application to design innovative measurement of trust and capacity building as outcomes of CBPR.

During the completion of the literature review for this proposal I was fortunate to find your dissertation research on "Trust as an ethical construct in CBPR partnerships". Your research is one of few empirically exploring a CBPR outcome. I wonder if you have been able to publish a peer review manuscript of this relevant study. In this vein, I want to utilize elements from the typology of trust developed by you, as well as various elements of your theoretical framework and methods to guide my study design. Therefore, I am requesting your approval to allow

me to utilize your research findings to orient my proposed study. Please kindly let me know if you approve this request. I will properly incorporate references of your research into my proposal and potential future publications.
