Dear Drs. Dietz and Den Hartog:

I am a Clemson University's research assistant professor, from the Dominican Republic, working in developing a funded research agenda on CBPR and health disparities reduction among U.S. Hispanics. I am currently working in submitting a grant application to conduct a qualitative study on perceptions of trust among Hispanic immigrant families who are actively participating in a culturally and linguistically adapted health preventative program (PASOs) in SC. This pilot project, if approved, will be developed in the context of the Community Engaged Research Scholars program at MUSC. The purpose of this scholars program is to nurture a community-academic partnership between myself and the PASOs executive director.
