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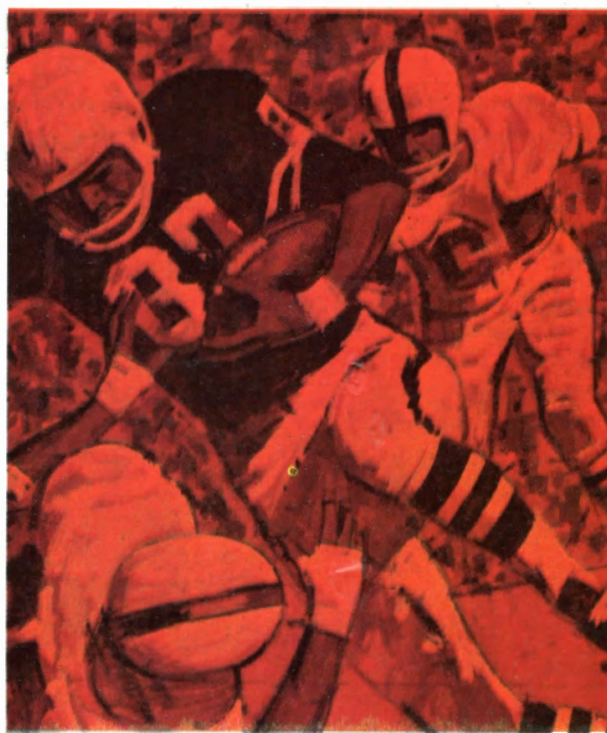

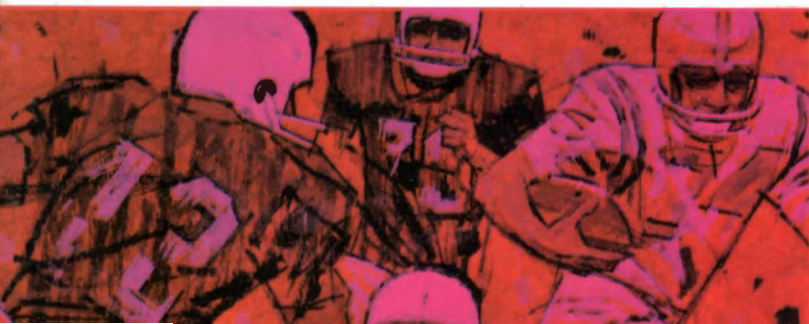

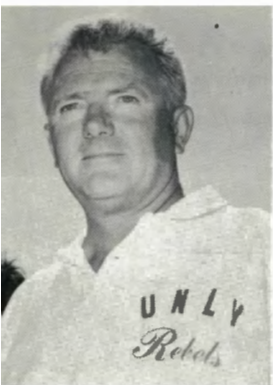

This is the first afternoon home game of the year for the Rebels and the University of Nevada, Las Vegas will be hosting the nationally-ranked University of North Dakota "Fighting Sioux."

The Sioux of coach Jerry Olsen will visit Las Vegas for the final game of their 10 game 1972 schedule, while UNLV will play one more game after today -- the fourth annual "Big Game" on Nov. 18 against rival University of Nevada, Reno.

In posting their 8-1 record to date, North Dakota started the season by winning six straight before losing in their own homecoming game, 22-17 to North Dakota State in their only blemish thus far.

UNLV is just the opposite with a 1-8 record and today's game is really important to the Rebels if they have any hope of salvaging something from this most frustrating season.

Last weekend, North Dakota beat Mankato State, 48-14, at home while UNLV traveled to the historic Orange Bowl only to bow to a rugged University of Miami team, 51-7, in only the second game in the short five-year history of Rebel football against a major college opponent.

Injuries and turnovers have been major contributors to the UNLV record this year and with the Homecoming game set for next weekend against UNR, Reb fans have a lot to look forward to as this year's squad is comprised of only a dozen seniors, and the experienced gained this year against a most competitive schedule will certainly help in the games remaining this year and the seasons to come.

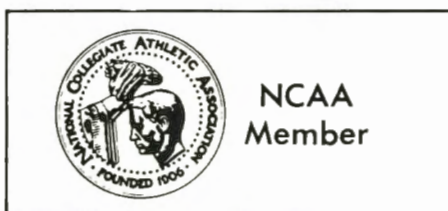
One of the highlight's of last week's game and trip to Miami was freshman tailback Tom Kunzer, who came off the bench to carry the ball five times for 32 yards and the lone UNLV touchdown on a 19 yard run in his first college game. He wears number 7 and will start at tailback today for the Rebels.

10. When was the first "Big Game" with UNR?



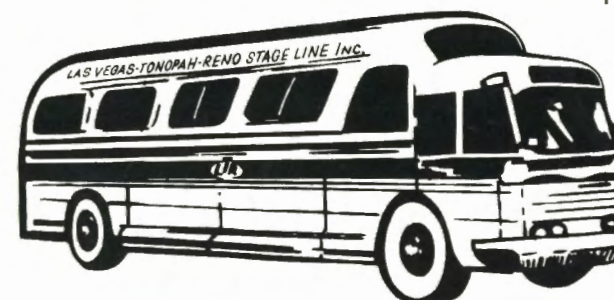

**SUDDEN DEATH OVERTIME** --irate coach mangling official timekeeper after final seconds ticked away during time out.

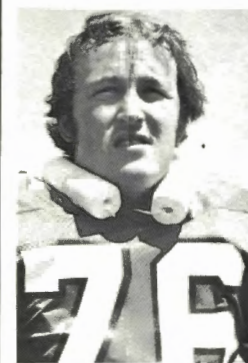
**CENTER DUMP** -- Spot out in the desert where you haul creaky old ball-snappers.

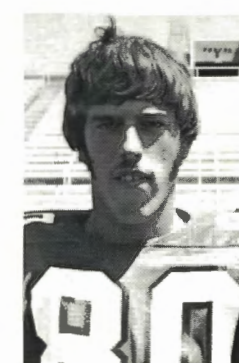

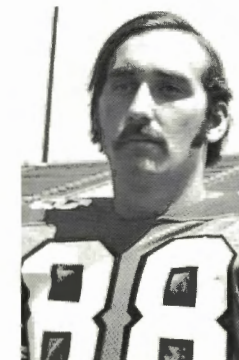

## UNLV Scene

There are 6,004 students enrolled this semester at UNLV, according to the official fall enrollment report issued by the registrar.

The total headcount figure includes 5,183 students who have been formally admitted and are seeking degrees, 784 non-degree students and another 37 auditing classes for no credit.

Clark County continues to supply the vast majority of regular students with 4,629. However, students from 43 states and 25 foreign countries have registered for coursework this term.

A separate report issued by the Dean of Men lists 69 undergraduate and graduate students from foreign lands. Five continents are represented in the report, with students hailing from as far away as Hong Kong, Thailand, Nigeria and the Philippines.

The age level of UNLV students reaches from 16 years all the way to 71, with some representation at nearly every year in between. The 18, 19, and 20-year-olds are still the most abundant with ranks of 692, 619 and 532, respectively.

The college with the largest enrollment is Arts and Letters with 1,214 regularly-enrolled students, followed closely by Education with 1,183. Third is the University College with 872, then Business and Economics, 624; Science and Mathematics, 494; Hotel Administration, 321; and Allied Health Professions, 267.

The men outnumber the women by 3,456 to 2,548. There are 1,597 married students and 3,584 singles.

Hotel Administration claimed the most undergraduate majors in its discipline with 320 students. Others with large enrollments include elementary education, 197; accounting, 132; psychology, 112; political science, 104; art 100; general business, 83; music and physical education, both 81; and management and engineering, both 70.

At the graduate level, elementary education lists 156 students; counseling and personnel services, 92; secondary education, 56; special education, 55; educational administration, 51; and business administration, 50.

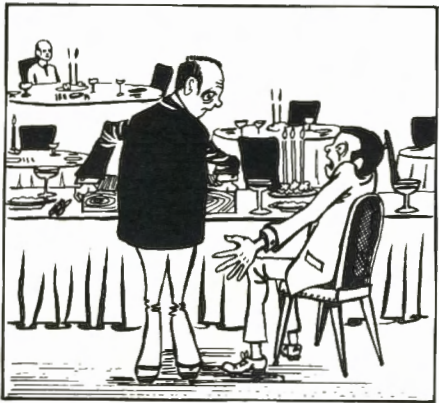
