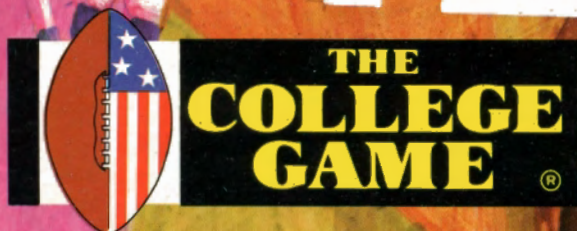
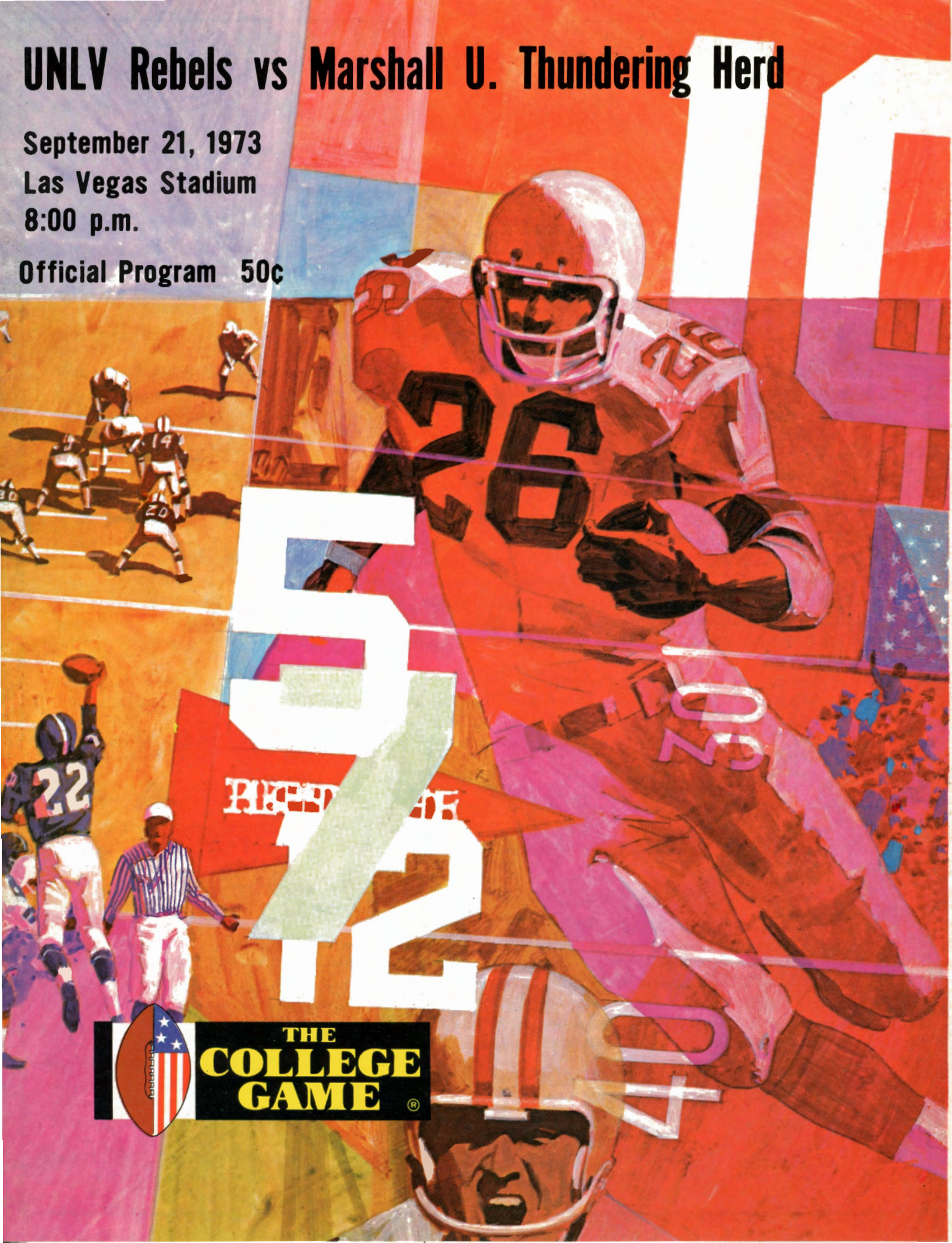

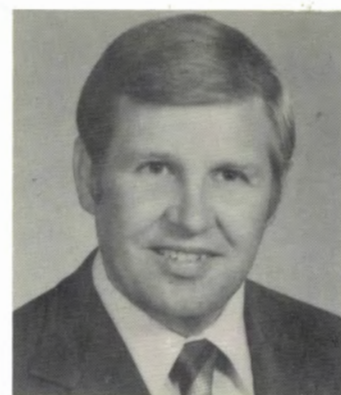

TONIGHT'S GAME

UNLV VS MARSHALL UNIVERSITY

"2-0 isn't bad, but 3-0 sounds even better."

That's the phrase echoed over the campus of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas as the Rebels prepared for the tonight's invasion of the Thundering Herd from Marshall University.

While Ron Meyer's Rebels enter the game with easy wins over the State College of Arkansas, 38-6 and Cal State, Los Angeles, 42-7, Jack Lengyel's Herd knocked off Morehead State of Kentucky, 24-17 in their season opener last weekend.

Like UNLV, Marshall had a poor year in 1972 with a 2-8 record, but back are 22 starters tonight who all played year ago and 17 who were lettermen.

In two games UNLV has proven to be a strong defensive and offensive team with a strong ground attack as evidenced by the number of school records set last week against CSLA.

As a team, UNLV tied the single-game mark for most attempts rushing (68) and set a new mark in most net yards gained rushing (370), and came in with the most first downs rushing (20) by any Rebel team before.

Individually, it was Mike Thomas night against CSLA as the 5-10, 188 pound diminutive keg of dynamite ramble for two school standards as he toted the pigskin 28 times for 183 net yards. The Greenville, Texas, native now has rushed 292 yards on 43 carries for a 6.8 per-carry average. He has scored four touchdowns, three rushing and one passing.

Rebel fans may see the home team take to the air more tonight than the previous two games as Marshall has a super-strong defensive line. UNLV has been effective in the few times they have thrown the ball, completing seven of 16 passes for 136 yards and four touchdowns.

Junior Jesse Roberts is the team's leading receiver with two catches for 53 yards and a 26.5 per catch average and two touchdowns.

Besides Thomas, rushing well for UNLV has been senior fullback Steve Matousek, who has churned the turf for 53 yards on 17 carries for a nine-yard average carry and one six-pointer.

The two big threats offensively for the Herd to watch tonight are quarterback Reggie Oliver and tailback Jon Lockett, who came off the bench against Morehead State and carried the ball 19 times for 103 yards and two touchdowns.

INVOLVEMENT is the word for the night, so let's get involved support actively, the Rebels as they grapple for win no. 3 in '73.

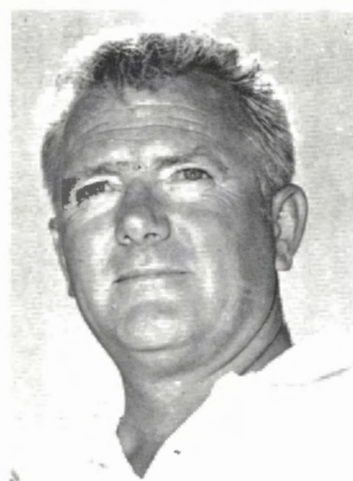

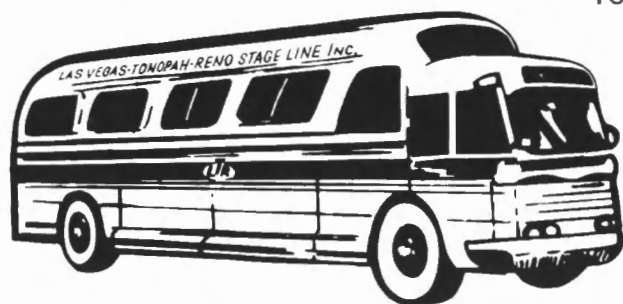

The Best Of Trivia

With the interest this week in the Billy Jean King vs Bobby Riggs tennis match, it is interesting to note that the sport of tennis was brought to this country from Bermuda by a woman.

A socially prominent young woman, Mary Outerbridge, literally carried tennis to the U. S. from Bermuda where she had spent a vacation. She had witnessed the game being played by British Army officers and thought it might be a diverting sport for women.

More diverting it certainly proved to be. Miss Mary Outerbridge carried home a tennis racket, net, balls and a pamphlet entitled "Shpairistike or Lawn Tennis", by Major Walter Clopton Wingfield of the British army.

Major Wingfield had chosen the word Shpairistike because it is the word "play" in Greek, the country where the game or a similar game began.

Wingfield's court was 60 feet long and 30 feet wide, slanting inward, hourglass fashion at the net, which was five feet high at the center. Today the court is rectangular, 78 feet long and 27 feet wide for singles play, 36 feet wide for doubles.

James Dwight helped found the U.S.L.T.A. and has become known as the father of American tennis. As a young medical student he participated in the first tournament recorded in the U.S., a round robin held in 1876 near Boston. For 21 years he served as president of U.S.L.T.A. before retiring in 1911.

The first U.S. championships for men were played in 1881 at a casino in Newport R.I. The winner was Richard Sears, who held that title for the next seven years in a row, a feat that has never again been matched.

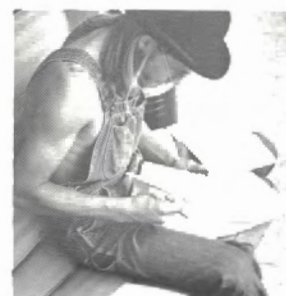
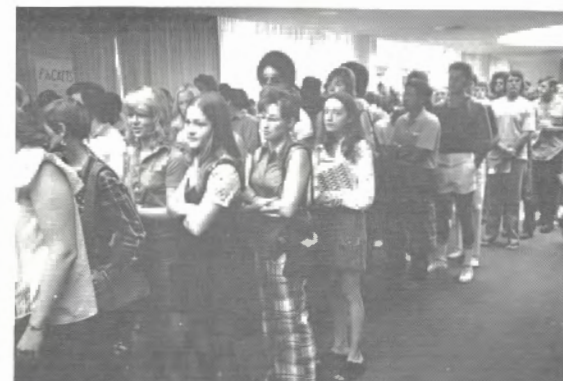


Enrollment at the UNLV campus took another jump this fall -- up six per cent over a year ago. Officials at the university believe there will be more than 6,500 students attending classes when all has been tabulated.

The hike comes at a time when many universities are experiencing enrollment declines. The national average, in fact, shows no increase. But UNLV continues to defy the trend.

There are 3,659 registered as full-time students and another 2,317 attending on a part-time basis this semester. Out-of-state enrollment stands at 409, an increase of about 15 per cent over a year ago.

Next fall, UNLV inaugurates an all-computerized registration system which will do away with the long lines and the frustrations that go along with them. Here is a look at how it went this time:

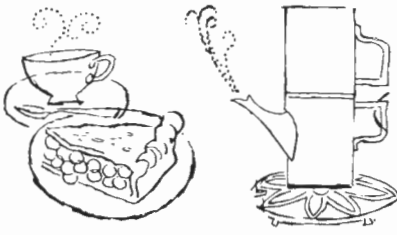

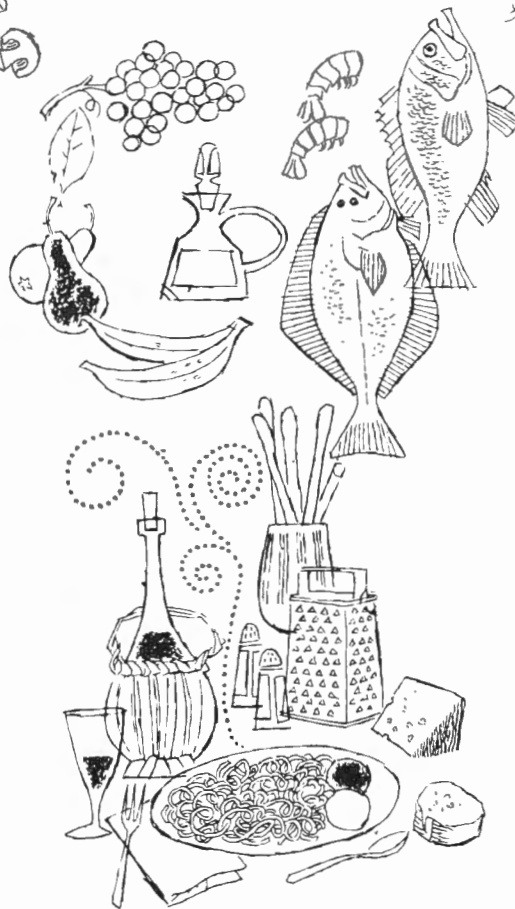
pounds ground beef

Mix ingredients and brown meat slowly in pan, then drain grease. Add following then simmer uncovered minutes:

1/2 tablespoon salt
teaspoon black pepper
teaspoon oregano
bay leaves
12-ounce and one 6-ounce can tomato paste and one 12-ounce can of tomato sauce

Place 3/4 box lasagne noodles, 1 teaspoon salt, and 1 tablespoon olive oil boiling water. Boil for 15 minutes, drain in hot, then cool water.

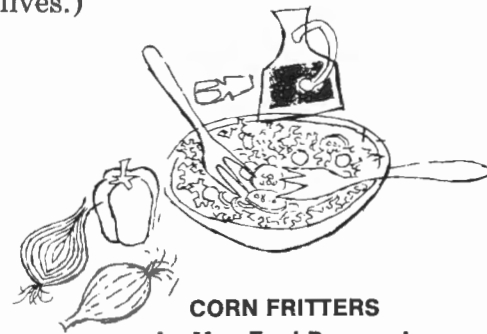
Mix in a bowl

1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
1 tablespoon sugar
1 scant teaspoon salt
1 egg
1 1/4 cup milk
1/2 cup whole kernel corn
fat for deep frying or pan frying

Resift flour, baking powder, sugar and salt together. Add egg, milk and corn. Stir until blended. Drop batter into fat a teaspoonful at a time. Fry until golden brown, turning to cook evenly. Drain on paper towel and sprinkle with confectionary sugar before serving.

OATMEAL ANGEL COOKIES (Swedish)

1 cup sugar
1 cup oatmeal
1/4 cup whipping cream
1/4 cup white corn syrup
2/3 cup butter
1 cup flour (little less)
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon vanilla

Put sugar and oatmeal together add melted butter, cream and corn syrup. Stir mixture then add flour and baking powder, and vanilla. Put a teaspoon at a time onto a greased cooking sheet. Bake about 9 minutes at 375°. Remove—stand for a minute on cookie sheet then place warm cookie on a rolling pin or a rounded object to form in the curled shape of an angel wing. The cookie should be a light colored brown around the edge before placing on the rolling pin.

CHILI STEW

Brown in butter—1 garlic button, 1 onion, 2 stalks celery and chili powder just to taste. Add 1 lb. ground round and brown. Add—2 cloves, 2 cups cooked macaroni, 2 small cans tomato sauce, 1 large can stewed tomatoes with juice, 2 small cans kidney beans without juice, Lawry's salt and pepper, 1 teaspoon chopped green chilies.

Cook until vegetables are done and not limp.

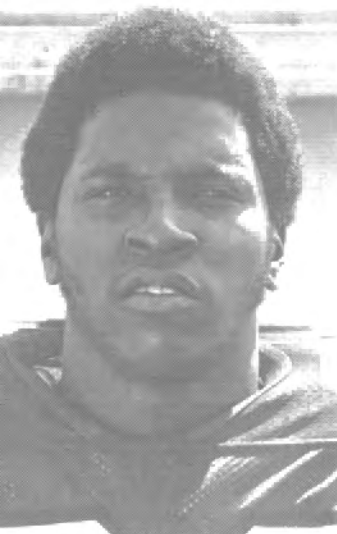
