1982 UNLV PRESEASON BASKETBALL PROSPECTUS

HEAD COACH JERRY TARKANIAN--Enters 1982-83 as the winningest active basketball coach in America and the third winningest of all time. Tark is entering his 10th season at UNLV and has a school mark of 202-63 (.762). Overall, in 14 years of major college coaching, he was the head mentor at Long Beach St. from 1968-73, he is 324-83 (.796). At UNLV, he has led the Runnin' Rebels to the NCAA Tournament in 1975, '76 and 1977, when UNLV placed third in the country and he also led UNLV to the National Invitation Tournament in 1980, where the Rebels placed fourth, and again in 1982. Tark is a 1955 grad of Fresno St.

ASSISTANT COACH TIM GRGURICH--Will be in his third season as a Rebel assistant coach. Prior to coming to UNLV Grgurich spent 16 seasons at Pittsburgh, 11 as an assistant (1964-75) and five years as head coach (1975-80). He graduated from Pitt in 1964.

ASSISTANT COACH MARK WARKENTIEN--Is also entering his third year with the Rebels and is UNLV's recruiting coordinator. Before coming to UNLV, Warkentien spent six months during the 1980 campaign with Cal-Irvine and before that, during the 1978-80 seasons, he was at Cal. St.-Fullerton. From 1977-78, he was the head women's coach at Cal-Riverside; from 1975-77 he was a part-time assistant at Saddleback JC and from 1973-75 he was a part-time assistant at Riverside City College. Warkentien is a 1976 grad from Cal. St.-Fullerton.

With seven lettermen returning, including three starters from last year's 20-10 squad that advanced to the second round of the 1982 National Invitation Tournament, UNLV head basketball coach Jerry Tarkanian looks to the upcoming collegiate season with optimism.

Pacing UNLV into its first year of Pacific Coast Athletic Association action will be returning starters--6-6 senior Larry Anderson from Pittsburgh, Pa., a three-year starter who led the team in scoring last year; 6-9 senior Sidney Green, another three-year starter from New York City who was No. 1 in rebounding and No. 2 in scoring in 1981-82 and 6-2 junior Danny Tarkanian from Las Vegas, son of head coach Jerry Tarkanian.

Last season, Anderson averaged 17.2 points, started all 30 games and led the team in minutes played with 1,050. For those efforts, he earned Sporting News Honorable Mention All America and Basketball Weekly Honorable Mention All West Coast.

Green last season averaged 16.7 points and 9.0 rebounds. For those numbers, he earned AP and Sporting News Honorable Mention All America and Basketball Weekly Honorable Mention All West Coast. For all three seasons at UNLV, Green has been awarded Honorable Mention All America.

Tarkanian in 1981-82 averaged 5.4 points and 1.8 rebounds, while credited with 57 steals and a school record 262 assists. He earned Sporting News Honorable Mention All America and Basketball Weekly second team All Junior College Transfer squad. In 1980-81, Tark played at Dixie College in St. George, Utah.

Supporting that cast will be four other returning lettermen, led by 6-8 junior Richie Adams, from New York City, who last season started 14 games and got 7.5 points and 4.7 rebounds a game.

The other returning lettermen are--6-9 senior Ken Lyles, who just recently underwent right knee surgery; 5-5 soph guard Leroy Byrd and 6-9 senior John Copeland, who was redshirted in 1981-82.

Easing the pain of the departure of two starters and top reserve--starters 6-6 Richard Box and 6-8 Michael Johnson and 6-4 Dwayne Polee--are Tark's new recruits, two transfers and three incoming freshmen.

The transfers are 6-10 junior center Paul Brozovich, who sat out last season at Saddleback Community College after playing two years (1979-81) at Pitt and 6-2 junior guard Jeff Collins. Collins was a two-year starter at Arizona who transferred to UNLV last January. He will be eligible to play second semester of the 1982-83 campaign.

The three incoming frosh are --6-6 Eldridge Hudson, considered by many prep experts to be the best high school forward in the country last year; 6-4 Gary Graham and 6-11 Georg Posti.

Hudson was the 1982 Los Angeles Player of the Year and led his Carson, Calif. squad to a 26-2 mark and the California State 4-A title. Graham led his Dunbar High School team from Baltimore Md. to a 28-0 mark and the Nos. 1 or 2 national prep ranking in the country, depending on the poll. Posti last season led his Ammerud basketball club team from Oslo, Norway to the Norwegian National Championship.

JERRY TARKANIAN
UNLV HEAD BASKETBALL COACH

Winning is something that Jerry Tarkanian, UNLV's head basketball coach, has done since he began his college coaching career at Pasadena City College 21 years ago. He is the winningest active major college basketball coach in America and is the third winningest coach overall.

Tarkanian's nine year record at UNLV is 202-63 (.762) and has reached the 20-win plateau thirteen out of the last fourteen years. Include in that total Tark's seven year stint in the junior college ranks and he has won 20 or more in 19 of 21 seasons.

Tarkanian's teams have finished as high as No. 3 in the nation. The 1976-77 team placed third in the NCAA Tournament and that same team set three regular season NCAA records including most games over 100 points, most consecutive games scored over 100 points and highest free throw percentage in a game. The Rebels also set three NCAA Tournament records and three NCAA consolation championship game records.

Tark's squads have also appeared in the NIT twice. In 1981-82, the Rebels beat Murray State in the opening round 87-61, but lost to Tulane in the second round 56-51. In 1980, UNLV's first time at the NIT, the Rebels reached the Final Four, losing to the eventual winner, Virginia. Overall, Tarkanian's NIT mark is 4-3.

While at UNLV, Tark has coached five active NBA players including Ricky Sobers and Reggie Theus of the Chicago Bulls, Glen Gondrezick of the Denver Nuggets, Robert Smith of the Cleveland Cavaliers and Brent Vroman of the Utah Jazz.

A native of Euclid, Ohio, Tarkanian attended Pasadena City College before graduating from Fresno State in 1955. He received his Master's degree from Redlands University in 1960.

Tarkanian and his wife, Lois, reside with their four children - Pamela, Jodie, Danny and George in Las Vegas.

Transfers

Paul Brozovich. . . 6-10. . . 235. . . Junior. . . Glassport, Pa.--Played at Pitt during the 1979-81 seasons, but sat out last year at Saddleback Community College. In 1979-80, as a freshman starter under then head coach Tim Grgurich, who is now an assistant at UNLV, Brozovich averaged 2.8 points and 1.9 rebounds as he averaged 11 minutes a contest and appeared in 28 games. That season, Pitt advanced to the NIT. In 1980-81, under present Pitt coach Dr. Roy Chipman, Brozovich appeared in 26 games and averaged 2.4 points and 2.7 rebounds while averaging 13.6 minutes a game. That season, the Panthers advanced to the NCAA Tournament. He just completed his Associate of Arts Degree at Saddleback, in Mission Viejo, Calif. He's a former prep standout at South Allegheny High School in Glassport, Pa.

Jeff Collins. . . 6-2. . . 159. . . Junior. . . Phoenix, Ariz.--Transferred to UNLV at midsemester 1981-82 from Arizona, where he was a two-year starter. Collins will be eligible to play second semester of 1982-83. As a soph under Fred Snowden at UA in 1981, the slam dunk artist appeared in 13 games and averaged 14.5 points, 2.4 rebounds, shot .507 from the field, .698 from the line and was credited with 31 assists. He appeared in four Pac-10 games in 1982--his final contest was on Jan. 9 against Washington St.--and he averaged 17.5 points and shot 56.5 from the field in those four league contests (Oregon, Oregon St., Washington and Washington St.) Collins also faced UNLV last season, on Dec. 3, when the Rebels beat Arizona, 69-49 in Tucson. In that contest, he got 16 points, four rebounds, one assist and blocked shot and two steals in 33 minutes of playing time. Nicknamed JC and Skywalker, during his freshman year at Arizona, Collins appeared in 27 games and played over 450 minutes. He averaged 6.6 points and 1.7 rebounds, shot .455 from the field and .707 from the line and was credited with 66 assists and 22 steals. Collins' career high at Arizona was 27 points, scored at Oregon on Jan. 2, 1982. In 1980, in his senior season at South Mountain High School in Phoenix, Ariz., Collins was considered the state's No. 1 prep player. That year, he averaged 17 points, nine rebounds and five assists a game while leading his squad to the Arizona State AAA runnerup spot, behind Phoenix East. Following his prep senior season, he earned Basketball Congress International All America, National High School Coaches All America and Arizona Daily Star Super Five team. He also played in the BCI Senior Prep Classic, held in Tucson. After his high school career, Collins competed in a National Slam Dunk Tournament, held at Provo, Utah, where he placed second to Gary Springer, now a star forward at Iona. During his frosh campaign at Arizona, 15 of his 75 field goals were slam dunks.

Gary Graham. . . 6-4. . . 175. . . Freshman. . . Baltimore, Md.-- Starting guard at Dunbar High School in Baltimore, Md..Graham's Dunbar High School and Calvert Hall, also located in a suburb of Baltimore, were ranked as the No. 1 and/or No. 2 high schools in the country following the 1981-82 season. Graham led Dunbar to a 28-0 record in 1981-82 and the team championship in the Maryland Scholastic Association. Dunbar has won the MSA six of the last seven years. In his senior season, Graham averaged 17.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists a game, playing the shooting guard position. As a junior, he played the point and averaged 10.0 points and 7.0 assists. After this season, Graham earned first team All State and All City honors, along with Honorable Mention Prep All America. Ernest, Gary's older brother, was a senior forward at Maryland this season and earned second team All Atlantic Coast Conference. A fine student, Gary has a B average at Dunbar and will major in Business/Hotel Management this Fall at UNLV. Graham's prep coach was Bob Wade.

Eldridge Hudson. . . 6-6. . .215. . . Freshman. . . Carson, Calif.--Considered by many prep basketball experts to be the best high school power forward in the country for 1981-82. In 1982, Hudson led his Carson squad to a 26-2 mark and the Calif. State 4-A title. As a senior, he averaged 22.3 points, 10.4 rebounds and 4.8 assists a game. He earned McDonald's, Parade and Street and Smith All America, Los Angeles City Player of the Year, Los Angeles Times Player of the Year, Long Beach Independent Best in the West and South Bay Daily Breeze Player of the Year. As a junior under coach Richard Acres, Hudson led his team to a 20-4 mark and averaged 26.3 points, 10.3 rebounds and 4.1 assists a game. As a soph, Carson was 14-9, with Hudson getting 14.7 points, 9.7 rebounds and 3.0 assists a contest.

Georg Posti. . . 6-11. . . 235. . . Freshman. . . Madla, Norway--A 1979 grad of St. Olav Videregaende, Posti, for the last 1½ seasons, played center on the Ammerud basketball club team in Oslo, Norway. His coach there was Robert Holm, a 1964-65 UNLV basketball letterman under former Rebel head coach Ed Gregory. In 1982, Posti led Ammerud to the Norwegian National Championship. While averaging 20.0 points and 12.5 rebounds a contest, Posti led his team to a 15-3 regular season record and into the National Playoffs, where Ammerud won the title.

MICHAEL 'SPIDERMAN' BURNS ONLY PLAYER TAKEN IN 1982 NBA DRAFT

Michael 'Spiderman' Burns, a 6-6, three-year letterman from Las Vegas' Chaparral High School who only played seven games of the 1981-82 season, was the only UNLV player chosen in the 1982 NBA draft--going in the eighth round to the Chicago Bulls.

Burns, who will join fellow UNLV alumni Reggie Theus and Ricky Sobers with the Bulls, played only the first seven games of the 1981-82 and missed the rest of the year due to academic reasons. In 1981-82, Burns averaged 11.0 points and 5.7 rebounds and was credited with eight assists, three blocked shots and 11 steals in 171 minutes of playing time. He started all seven games and his high for 1981-82 was 18 points at Brigham Young.

Burns was a starter throughout most of his UNLV career and lettered from 1978-81. He was a co-captain in 1980-81.

He holds two school individual game records--most assists (18, vs. Hawaii, 2-21-81) and most steals (6, vs. Cal St.-Northridge, 12-12-78).
