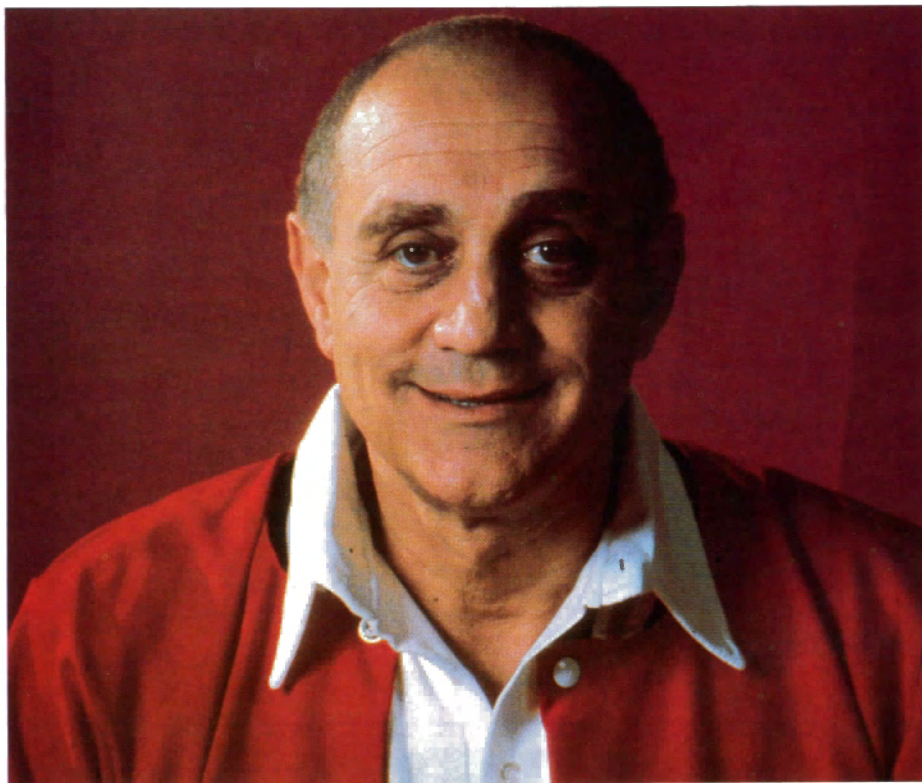

JUBULATION! A PCAA Championship!

HEAD COACH and ASSISTANT ATHLETIC DIRECTOR JERRY TARKANIAN 1983 UPI Coach-of-the-Year



For almost a quarter of a century Jerry Tarkanian's home has been the basketball court. And every year, as he presides as the head of this prestigious household, he preaches virtues such as hard work, discipline and loyalty.

It has been a happy home for as long as anyone can remember — or at least the past 22 consecutive seasons. And for the 11th straight year, Tarkanian will head one of Las Vegas' most successful and closely knit families — the UNLV Runnin' Rebel Basketball team.

Tarkanian may be regarded as the fatherly figure to some, especially his son Danny, who is the Rebels' starting point guard, but all regard him as one of the basketball's finest collegiate coaches of all time.

Not only does Tarkanian's career record (352-86) distinguish him as the winningest active collegiate basketball coach, but he seems to emerge at the zenith of every basketball category. Take last season (1982-83) as an example:

The Rebels finished the year with an overall mark of 28-3, which ranked second only to the University of Houston. They completed PCAA conference play with a first place mark of 15-1 and swept the post-season tournament. They advanced to the NCAA Western Regional tournament, but were knocked out by North Carolina State

— the 1983 National Champs — in the final minutes. Both wire services considered the Rebels worthy of a No. 6 ranking.

While at UNLV, Tarkanian has molded the Rebels into a veritable basketball dynasty. Within his ten seasons at UNLV, Tarkanian has compiled records of 28-3, 20-6, 24-5, 29-2, 29-3, 20-8, 21-8, 23-9, 16-12 and 20-10. Tarkanian has never suffered a losing season as a head coach and has only dropped below the 20 win mark two seasons (1962, 14-13, 1981, 16-12).

The Runnin' Rebels have traveled to six NCAA and five NIT post-season tournaments while under Tarkanian's command. The Rebels' placed third in the NCAA National Tournament in 1976-77 after defeating North Carolina-Charlotte 106-94 in the consolation game. In 1980 they placed in the final four of the NIT championships. The Runnin' Rebels once again advanced to the second round of the NIT's in 1982, only to lose to Tulane. UNLV currently holds a 8-5 post-season record.

The 1976-77 Rebels achieved six post-season records, including most points in a five game series (505), most field goals in a five game series (218), most points in one post season contest (121 vs. U. of San Francisco), most points, two teams (200 vs. UNCC), and most points by one team in a consolation championship (106 vs. UNCC).

UNLV was selected as the number four team in the land by the Associated Press poll and the number six team by the United Press International poll after that monumental 1976-77 season.

The Runnin' Rebels also advanced to NCAA playoff action in the 1974-75 season. The 1974-75 sub-regional game was played on the campus of Arizona State against a powerful San Diego State squad. The Rebs defeated the Aztecs 90-80 and advanced to the NCAA Regional Tournament where they met their previous host school — Arizona State. Although the Rebels were edged by the Sun Devils, 84-81, they bounced back to capture the consolation title by defeating a heavily favored University of Montana team, 76-67.

The only two teams who conquered the Rebels on their home court during the 1973-74 campaign were the University of Houston, 75-72, and Texas Tech, 82-76. The Rebs tallied a successful record at their old home, the Las Vegas Convention Center. At one point the Runnin' Rebels posted a 72 game homecourt streak — which is the longest homecourt streak in the NCAA history books. Their historical string of home wins was curtailed by the University of New Mexico in 1977-78, narrowly losing 102-98.

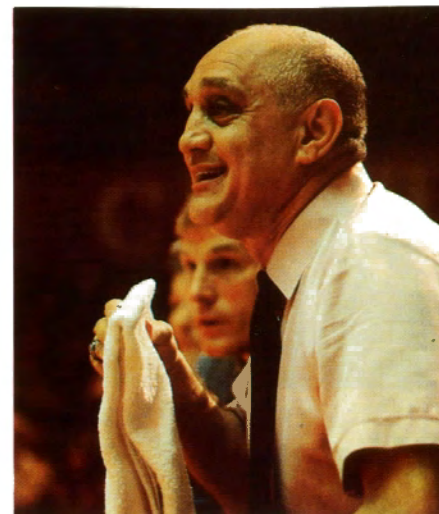
The 15 NCAA records Tarkanian's Rebels hold is just an offshoot of their winning tradition. Among the national records are: 110.5 points per game average in 1975-76; most points in one game, 164 (Hawaii-Hilo, 1975-76); a winning streak of 72 home games.

Tarkanian has not only transformed UNLV into a formidable basketball power, but he has performed similar magic acts at other schools. Riverside City College, Tarkanian's first coaching stint, was in the cellar of its conference for two straight seasons. Tarkanian turned the program around, and through the years 1962-66 compiled an overall record of 131-9 in which he produced three state champions.

Tarkanian then ventured to Pasadena City College who was, at that time, at the bottom of its conference. Through the years 1966-68 he amassed a 67-4 record and forged his fourth state title.

While at Long Beach, 1969-73, Tarkanian never lost a home bout in five straight seasons, and at one point, had a string of 65 wins. No other Junior College coach in the history of California basketball has even come close to his grandeur.

Another attribute that Tarkanian, who was named U.P.I. Coach of the Year last season, has mastered is the ability to recruit. He is known in almost all basketball circles as the "Pied Piper of Basketball Recruiting," — a



title that he is indeed worthy of.

Every year, no matter how scarce the recruiting field looks, he seems to attract only the top prospects.

Among the top recruits Tarkanian managed to lure in while at Long Beach were: George Trapp, Chuck Terry, Ed Ratleff, Leonard Gray and Roscoe Poindexter. While his winning tradition grew at UNLV, so did his reputation as one of the masters of the recruiting field. Throughout his 11 years at UNLV Tarkanian has attracted stars such as High School All-Americans Eddie Owens (Houston, Texas), Lewis Brown and Jackie Robinson (both from Los Angeles). Eight years ago he recruited Robert Smith (Los Angeles), five years ago he brought Sam Smith (Las Vegas) and Reggie Theus (Inglewood, California), six years ago he reeled in all-star junior college center Larry Moffett (Gary, Indiana), and four years ago he attracted Richard Box (Riverside, California) and Michael "Spiderman" Burns (Las Vegas).

In 1979-80 three more high school All-America players elected to attend UNLV. They were: 1979 New York City Player of the Year Sidney Green, 1979 Pittsburgh Player of the Year Larry Anderson and 1978 Los Angeles Player of the Year Michael Johnson.

Within the last three seasons Tarkanian has added several top notch recruits to the UNLV roster. Among the recent recruits are his son Danny, the 1982 Los Angeles Player of the year Eldridge Hudson, former San Francisco University star Eric Booker and Jeff Collins.

This year, Tarkanian has done it again, as far as attracting the top caliber players. *Sporting News* rated UNLV as having the fifth best recruiting year by attracting players such as, Las Vegas superstar Fred Banks (Valley High), John Flowers (Fort Wayne, Indiana), Frank "Spoon" James (Baltimore, Maryland), Ed Catchings (Los Angeles) and Richard Robinson (Granada Hills, California).

Many of Tarkanian's players do not end their basketball careers at college — for them college basketball is just a beginning. Among the players that have gone on to the professional ranks are Chuck Terry (Houston Rockets), Eric McWilliams (Houston Rockets), George Trapp (Detroit Pistons), Bob Rule (Cleveland Cavaliers), Ed Ratleff (Houston Rockets), John Q. Trapp (Los Angeles Lakers), Glenn MacDonald (Boston Celtics) and Leonard Gray (Seattle Supersonics). UNLV Alumni professional players also include Ricky Sobers (Chicago Bulls), Larry Moffett (Houston Rockets), Eddie Owens (Buffalo Braves), Jackie Robinson (Seattle Supersonics), Sam Smith (Chicago Bulls), Glen Gondrezick (Denver Nuggets), Sidney Green (Chicago Bulls), and Reggie Theus (Chicago Bulls). Theus, Green, Sobers, Robert Smith and Gondrezick are all still active in the NBA.

In Tarkanian's ten years at UNLV, 19 players have been drafted by the NBA. Six players from the 1976-77 team alone were drafted by the NBA — which is an NCAA and pro-basketball record.

Tarkanian has been honored with other coaching duties throughout his stellar career. He has coached in Ecuador for the People-to-People Sports Committee in April and May of 1968 and he coached the Junior College Olympic Team of that same year.

In the summer of 1983, Tarkanian added another feather to his cap as he accepted the position of Assistant Director of Athletics with designated duties as Director of Community Relations for the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics in the community of Las Vegas and the state of Nevada.

A native of Euclid, Ohio, Tarkanian attended Pasadena City College before graduating from Fresno State in 1955. He then went on to earn his masters degree — with honors — in Educational Management from Redlands University.

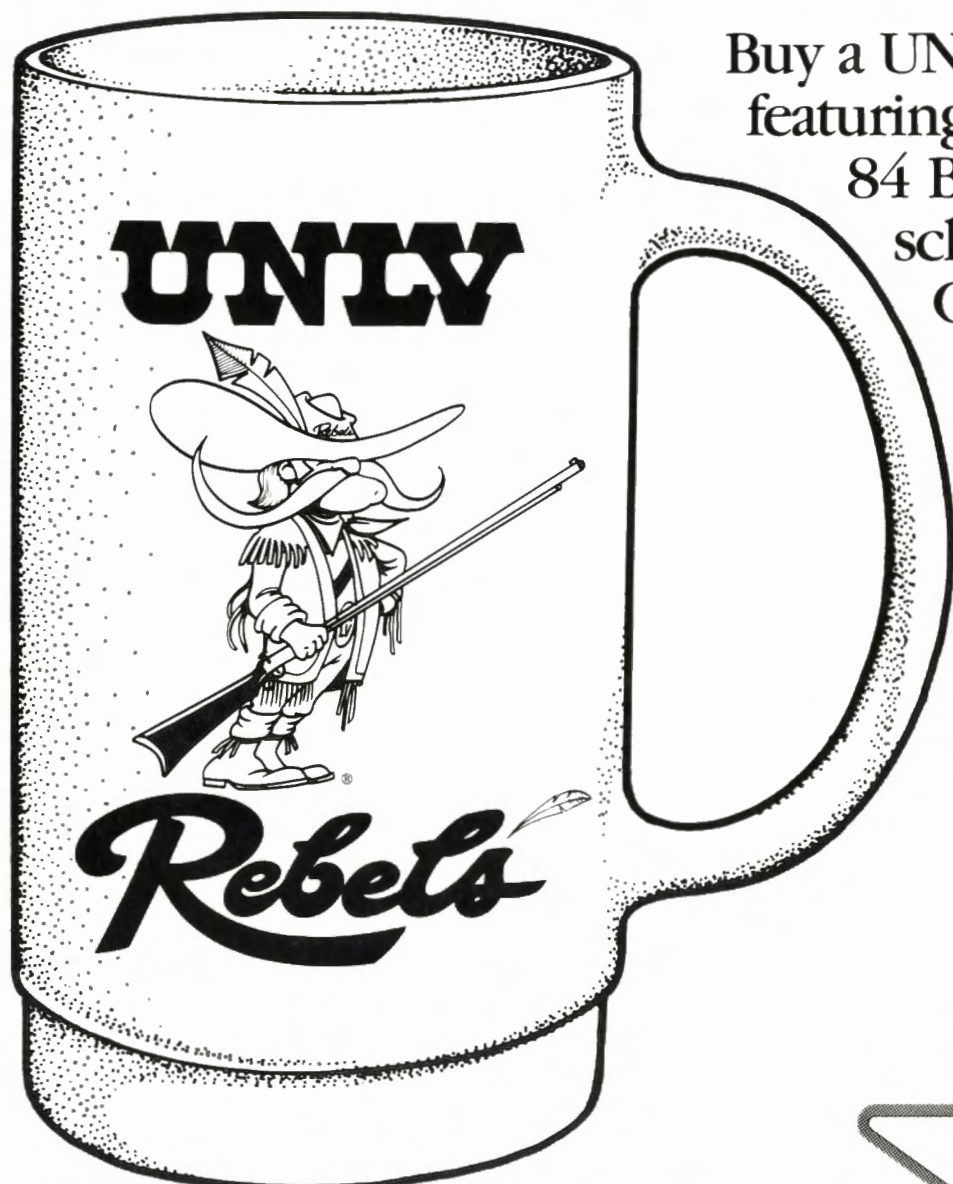

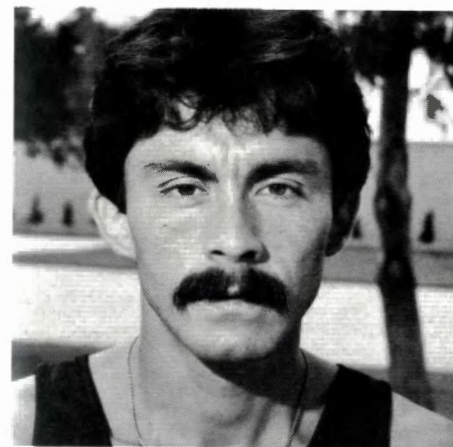
FALL SPORTS ROUND-UP

MEN CAPTURE THIRD IN PCAA

When the final Rebel harrier cross the finish line at this year's PCAA Championships Coach Al McDaniels was gleaming with pride, thinking to himself "I told you so, I told you so." For it was only three months prior to that day when the Rebels, who turned in a third place PCAA finish, were not even considered worthy of a ranking.

"We sure surprised a few people," McDaniels said with dignified smirk. "It was a great season because last year we finished in sixth place, and they didn't even bother to rank us this season."

McDaniels is a master engineer. He plan-

ned his strategy prior to the season to peak at just the right time — and it worked. "We reached the kind of goals that we set," he said. "Before the season began we sat down and planned the goals we were going to achieve. We first worked on power and strength and didn't worry about speed, because it only takes a few weeks to peak on speed work."

The highlight of the season occurred at the PCAA Championships when two Rebels earned All-Conference honors. The top Rebel finisher at the Championships was senior Melvin Thompson who took second with a 30:27, his best ever. Also earning All-Conference honors was senior German Aranda. Aranda placed in the seventh slot with a time of 30:37, which bettered his finish last year by more than 15 seconds.

McDaniels was exceedingly pleased with several other of his hard working harriers. Junior Ron Castonguay bettered his lifetime best by almost two minutes and "really came on at the end of the season."

Gary Vilas, who came to UNLV with very little 10K experience, emerged as one of the team's most consistent runners. Vilas improved so much that "he never saw the 32 minute barrier, he just jumped right over it into the 31 minute range," McDaniels said.

Mark Valenti was another Rebel that achieved the expectations that were set. "The pressure was really on Valenti because he was our fifth man," McDaniels said. "He was able to withstand the pressure and through hard work he really came through for us."

The Rebels' two freshman proved that they indeed has the potential to be outstanding someday. Both Brian Bradburn and Rickey Newton turned in their best times ever on some of the most demanding 10k courses.

Although the team loses its two top runners next year McDaniels is already looking to replace them with some top caliber talent.

"If we can replace them with two runners that are as good, if not better, than Melvin and German than we will become one of the best teams in the PCAA and one of the better teams in the District 8 region," McDaniels said.

LADY REBEL MAKING STRIDES

Mike Strong Head Coach of the Lady Rebel Cross Country team reflected on this year's season in an ironic, but logical manner.

"In order to have a good cross country team at UNLV, we're going to have to have a cross country team," he said.

The last statement can not be fully understood unless all the circumstances and facts about the Lady Rebels Cross Country program are revealed. UNLV does not have a cross country team "per se," only cross country runners. The majority of the Lady Rebels were transformed middle distance runners due to the lack of depth on the roster. Temporarily altering middle distance runners into lengthy mileage runners can be compared to having offensive linemen turn cartwheels on a balance beam. Well, it may not be as difficult as having 250 lb. offensive guards finding their center of gravity, but it is, none the less, a difficult transition to make.

Because of the few bonifide distance runners on the Lady Rebel roster, the team did

not fair as well as Strong has hoped. The Lady Rebels placed third in the first ever PCAA Cross Country Championships held in Santa Barbara. They also turned in a third place finish in their own UNLV Invitational earlier this season.

There were some highlight of the season despite the lack of depth. Most of the optimism radiated from freshman sensation Helen Reluga. Reluga, a recruit out of Thunder Bay, Ontario Canada, had several top finishes this season and ran 3,000 meters as fast as 17:28. Helen needs other people

here that can run and push her and make her develop," Strong explained. "She had a good year but it was difficult for her because she wasn't pushed. She did not run as well as she was capable of running. I don't necessarily blame it on her though."

Another bright spot on the Lady Rebel squad this year was with the performance of sophomore Therese Nolans. Nolans lowered her lifetime best time by almost a minute, running a 19:12 at the Stanford Invitational.

Other Lady Rebels who contributed to the team this season were Barny Caral, Sonya Briscoe and Suzy Hensel (who all three ran their life time best cross country time).

The key to next years season solely lies in recruiting.

"We have to get at least three kids as good, if not better than Helen and Maria Reluga (who has to sit out this year due to a hamstring injury)," Strong said. "Helen and Maria are work horses, but we need more like them. But we can't recruit just average kids — we can't afford to do that — we have to go for the best."

With the top caliber recruits, Strong says the difference will be like, "day and night." Already Strong has a six page list of potential recruits, and is working diligently day and night to attract the best. "Recruiting is the whole ball game," he earnestly stated. "Recruiting is about 75 percent of coaching. Almost 50 percent of the coaches in the country can coach, but you have to have the horses to be a good team."

Strong believes that he can mold the type of team that is worthy of national recognition. "It is significant that Dr. Rothermel is committed to excellence in all the sports programs. Without a person like him, the ship would go down very rapidly."

REBELS BEGIN WITH FALL BALL

The UNLV baseball team finished the 1983 fall ball season with a 15-6 record, including winners of their last nine. The Rebels swept the Taft baseball club, lost three out of four to University of Arizona and Arizona State, and swept Southern Utah State, Dixie College, and the University of Utah.

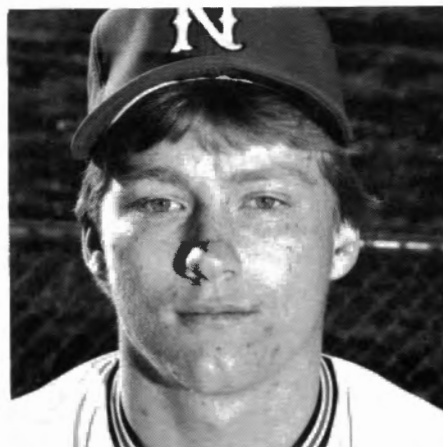
Leading the way for the Rebels on the mound was sophomore Mel Stottlemire who compiled a 4-0 record with a 1.04 ERA. Stottlemire, who recently attended an Olympic tryout in Louisville, KY, struck out 25 batters in 26 innings. Mel hurled a two-hit shutout over Arizona State in Tempe, AZ

on October 28. Another bright spot was Mel's younger brother Todd, Todd, who came on strong in the end, led the Rebel staff with 30 strikeouts in 29 innings.

Leading the Rebels at the plate was sophomore infielder Moser, who sported a .537 average. Moser was 22 for 41 including an 8 for 10 outing with two home runs in a doubleheader vs the University of Utah. Also junior catcher Tim Arnold batted

449 with 18 runs batted in. Senior leftfielder Bobby Thompson batted .415 with 13 runs batted in and five extra base hits (3 2B, 1 3B, 1 HR).

Overall, the Rebels batted .349 in the fall and the pitching staff had a 4.02 ERA and four shutouts over Taft, Arizona State, Southern Utah State, and Utah.

The Rebels open the 1984 season on Friday, February 3 against the University of Arizona in Tucson. The 69-game schedule will include 43 home games and 26 road games. The Rebels will also begin their first season in the Southern California Baseball Association (SCBA). The Rebels will play 28 league games with: Cal-State-Fullerton, UC-Irvine, Loyola-Marymount University, UC-Santa Barbara, University of San Diego, Pepperdine University, Cal State-Long Beach.

Fred Dallimore, entering his eleventh season as the skipper, sports a 348-255-1 record.

ON THE ROAD TO THE NCAA's

The UNLV Rebel soccer team will host Cal-Berkeley November 16 (8:00 pm) at Peter Johann Field in the opening round of the Far West Regional in the NCAA Tournament. The Rebels finished the season ranked 14th - by the Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America - and a ranking of third in the Far West Region.

UNLV has come a long way this season. The Rebs are now 16-3-1 which is the best record in the 10-year history of Rebel soccer. The Rebels have played against some top notch competition, including UCLA, San Francisco, Santa Barbara, Fresno State and Mid-Eastern powers Wisconsin-Green Bay and Evansville.

Since an early season 2-0 loss to Fresno State, the Rebels had a winning streak of six games (until UCLA defeated UNLV 1-0) and just had a five game winning streak (following a tie against Santa Barbara) broken by Fresno State's 2-1 victory in the PCAA Championship game played November 14.

"The NCAA's is what we have worked for all season," said Barto. "The kids are really up for this opportunity and a NCAA bid would be of great benefit for the soccer program here at UNLV."

Looney's stands across from the Liberace Museum, in a shopping mall owned by the man himself. You might expect it to be dripping with candelabras and sequins, but it's not. Although the 250-gallon aquarium that divides the restaurant from the enormous rectangular bar is eye-catching, the pizzazz here is supplied by the artwork of Las Vegas locals. The Las Vegas hotshots—casino executives and lawyers—who make this bar a popular after-work spot, come not only to drink and nibble on the fried zucchini and chicken fingers but to buy up the photos and oil paintings.

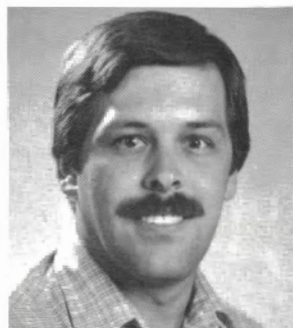
The most impressive feature of the facility is its 18,000 seat arena. Spectators have optimal sight lines from arm-chair seats in 51 rows on two tiers.

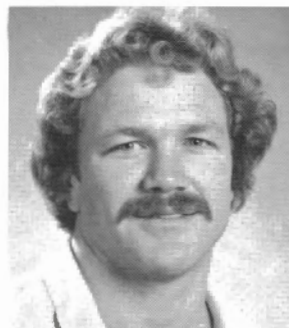

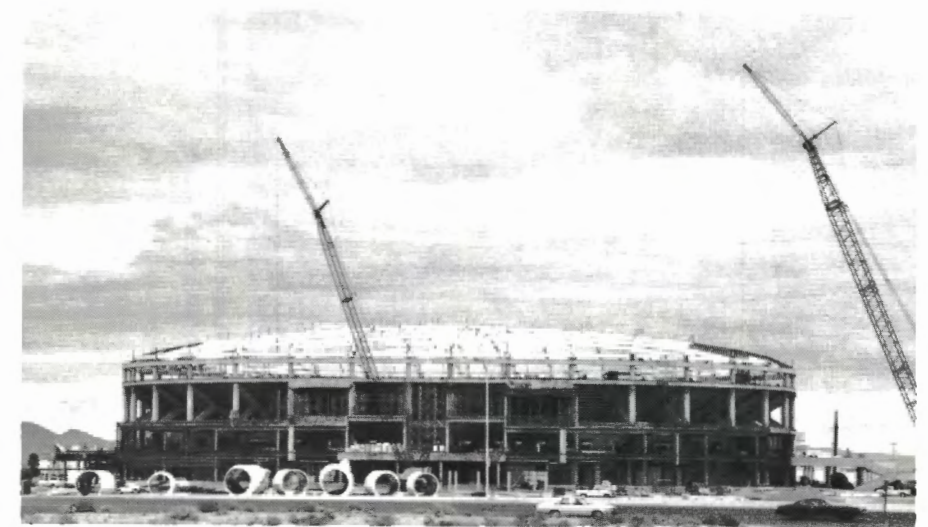

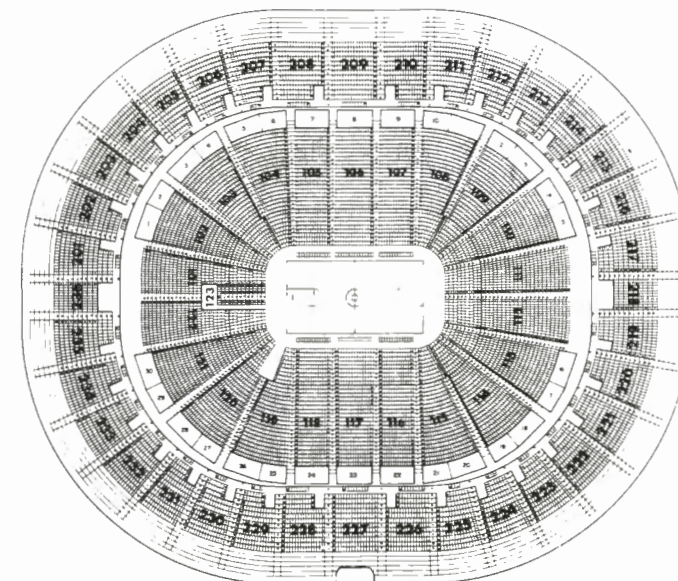

The University of Nevada, Las Vegas

The University of Nevada, Las Vegas, one of the fastest growing institutions of higher education in the southwest, is a component of the University of Nevada System, which is governed by the seven-member Nevada Board of Regents.

THE HISTORY: The past academic year marked UNLV's 25th anniversary. The extensive academic programs provided on UNLV's large, beautiful campus prove the explosive growth of higher education since its birth in southern Nevada. After several years of providing extension courses in southern Nevada staffed by faculty from the University of Nevada in Reno, the state legislature officially established the Southern Regional Division of the university in 1957. That same year the first building on campus—Maude Frazier Hall—was opened. By the mid-1960's, the university had become a four-year degree-granting institution known as Nevada Southern University. Full autonomy, with status equal to UNR, came in 1968. The following year the regents gave the campus its new name: University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV).

THE CAMPUS: The 335-acre campus is located two miles from the Las Vegas Strip in the heart of a busy commercial and residential area. On-campus facilities serve over 11,000 graduate and undergraduate students as well as provide a center for cultural and extended educational experiences for the community. Points of interest on the campus include the following: **Museum of Natural History**—With specialized exhibits to illustrate the story of man in this region, the museum is open from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday-Saturday. Visiting groups are encouraged to call for arranged tours. There is no admission charge. 739-3381.

Atrium and Aviary—This lush garden and bird sanctuary is located in the lobby of Juanita Greer White Hall. The building is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays. 739-3399.

Art Gallery—Exhibits by students, faculty and nationally renowned artists are changed every 2-3 weeks in the gallery, which is located in the northwest corner of the Alta Ham Fine Arts Building (HFA-153). Hours are noon to 4 p.m., Monday-Saturday.

McDermott Physical Education Center—This large, well equipped facility is open to the public. Hours vary, phone number: 739-3150/3157.

Center for the Performing Arts—At the northern end of the campus mall are two auditoriums: Artemus W. Ham Concert Hall, which is the scene of regularly scheduled concerts (739-3801); and Judy Bayley Theatre, where plays are staged throughout the year (739-3666). On the plaza area between them is The Flashlight, a 38-foot-tall, 74,000-pound steel sculpture by internationally known artist Claes Oldenburg.

THE EXPANSION: During the past three years, UNLV has embarked on an ambitious, \$60 million construction program which has resulted in four new buildings on campus—three of them the direct result of local philanthropy.

Ground was broken in 1981 for the Thomas and Mack Center, an 18,000-seat sports pavilion. Construction is expected to be completed by November 1983, when the Runnin' Rebels take to their new home basketball court. The university expects to book a wide variety of events into this spacious facility, named for long-time university donors E. Parry Thomas and Jerome Mack.

Construction also was completed in 1983 on an \$11.7 million building to house both the College of Business and Economics and the College of Hotel Administration—Frank and Estella Beam Hall (named for the parents of donor Thomas T. Beam). In addition to many specialized facilities to meet the needs of both colleges, the structure features a semi-covered outdoor patio.

A generous gift from local attorney Artemus W. Ham, Jr., provided the seed money for the recently opened Alta Ham



Humanities Building

Fine Arts Building. Named for Ham's late mother, the \$5 million facility houses the theatre arts, music, art and dance programs. It also contains an innovative Black Box Theatre for smaller-scale theatre productions as well as the campus' Fine Arts Gallery.

Finally, a \$7 million, four-story addition to the James R. Dickinson Library opened in Fall 1981, providing special facilities and more room for the expanded library holdings required by a growing student population.

THE FACULTY: A distinguished faculty of more than 400 men and women are actively involved in teaching, research and community service. Faculty members, 77% with doctorates, have come to UNLV from many of the great learning centers of the country — M.I.T., Yale, Harvard, Berkeley, Stanford.

THE PROGRAMS: Bachelor's degrees are awarded in 46 major subjects, and there are 26 programs which lead to master's degrees. Specialist degrees and doctorates are offered in the field of education. All programs have been fully accredited by the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges.

THE CALENDAR: UNLV operates on the semester system, with a Mini Term offered between the fall and spring semesters. During the summer there are two five-week summer sessions. The arrangement of course offerings provides students with a wide range of scheduling possibilities.

THE COMMUNITY: The Las Vegas community is served directly by an ambitious continuing education program at UNLV. Approximately 16,000 local residents take part annually in more than 500 credit and non-credit courses. These "Classes for People" are designed with a wide range of potential students in mind.

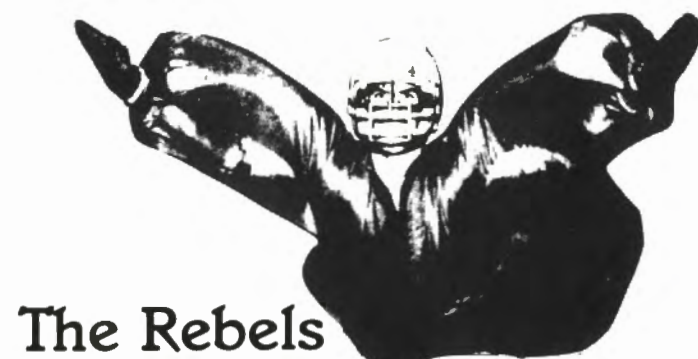

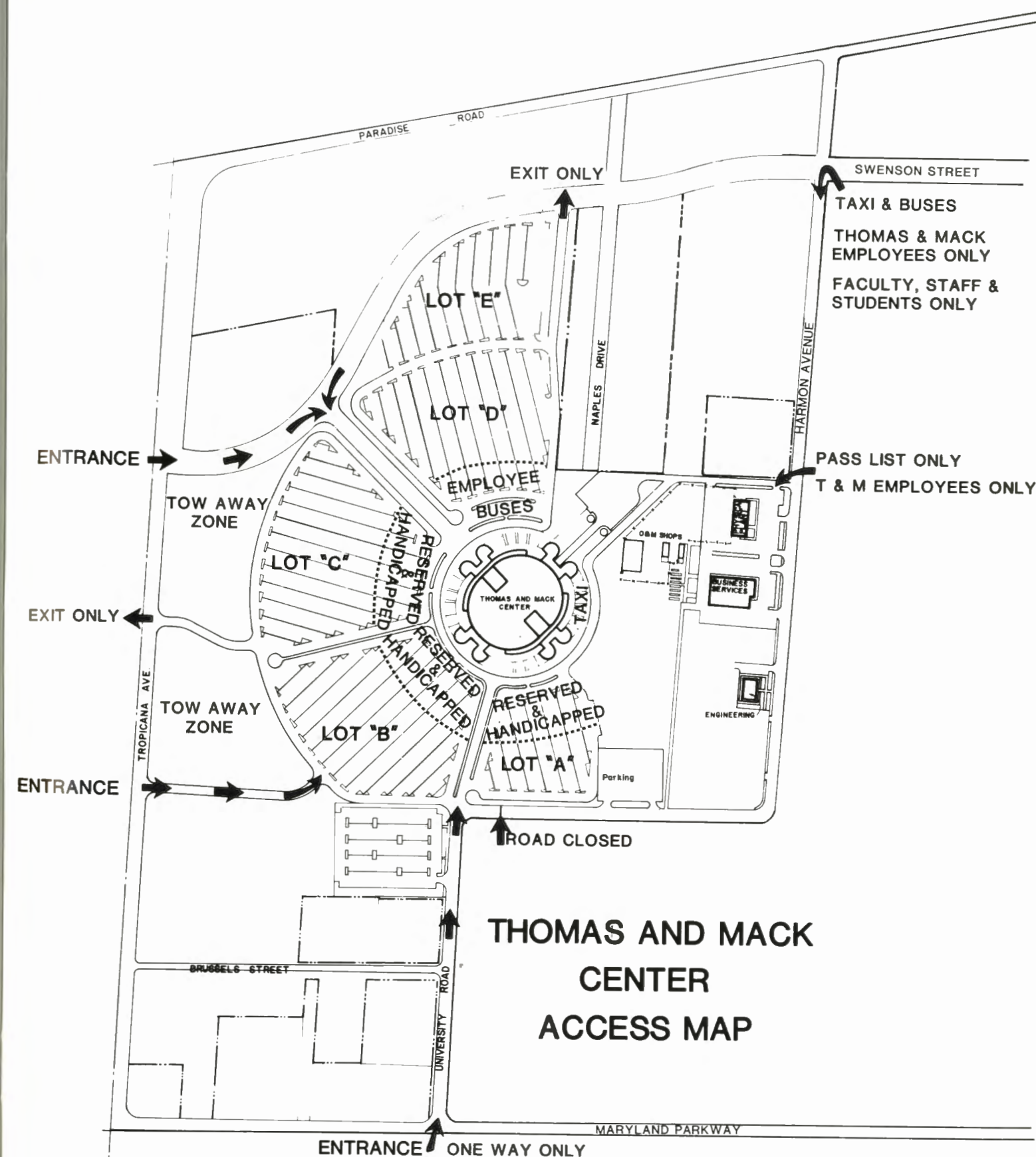

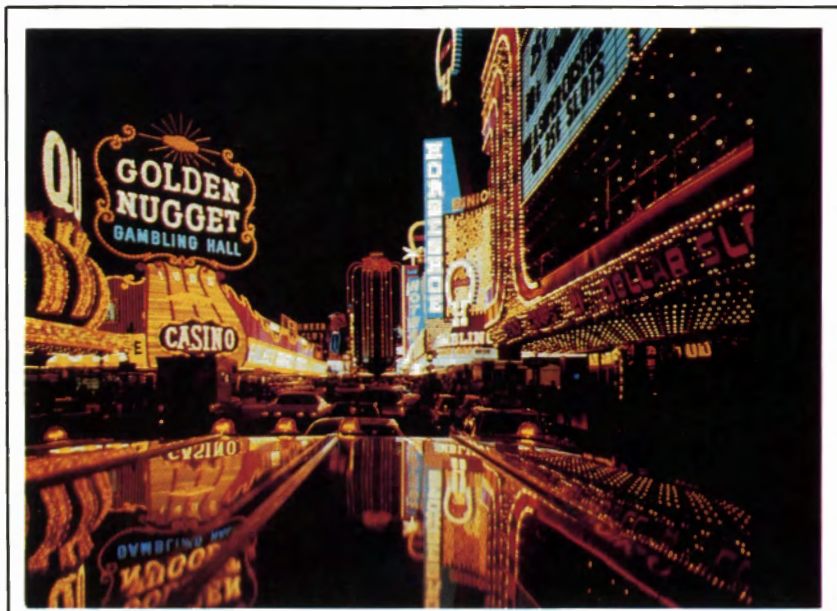


LAS VEGAS / THE CITY

LADY REBS READY FOR SEASON

When the UNLV Lady Rebel basketball squad were left out of post-season play last year following a sparkling record of 24-4, there may have been some disappointment on the part of UNLV staff and fans. After all, it was one of the best seasons in the history of the Lady Rebel program. But it must be realized that much of that team is back which makes the future of the program seem so bright.

Co-Head Coaches Sheila Strike and Jim Bolla, in their first season of equal status (Bolla was an assistant previously), are beaming over the prospect of a Top 20 national ranking.

"We have a strong nucleus of sophomore players this year who saw a lot of action as freshmen," said Strike. "We are a young team and we also have four new players, but it's deceiving because we do have experience."

That's a combination that the coaching duo, who are married to each other, are counting on to propel the Lady Rebels to an even better season this time out. Back at the guards positions are two players who turned in stellar performances last year. Senior Rochelle Oliver, a 5-7 senior from Bakersfield, CA, was the second leading scorer for the Lady Rebs with a 17.3 average. Oliver was the only player to start all 28 games last year. At the other guard will be Misty Thomas, a 5-11 sophomore from Windsor, Ontario, Canada, averaged 12.1 ppg and led the team in assists with 147.

Thomas was one of four freshmen who saw prominent roles last year, something that will have to happen again.

"The freshmen will have to play for us," said Bolla. "They will have the opportunity to play in situations, which will keep some of the pressure off them. It will be a learning experience for them."

"We have four freshmen this year," added Strike. "All four have the caliber to play and we're hoping to have at least two contribute this season."

Returning forwards are senior Lori Arent and sophomore Donya Monroe. Arent, a 6-1 transfer from the University of Pittsburgh, missed the first part of last season but then joined the team to play in 19 games and average just under five points/game. A strong inside player, Arent averaged 4.5 rebounds a game.

Monroe, another of last year's super frosh class, started 27 games, scored 10.4 ppg, averaged 8.2 rebounds/game and was tied for second on the team with eight blocked shots.

Both Arent and Monroe saw action at center along with still another freshman Tara Garlepp. The 6-5 sophomore played in 24 games last year, led the team in blocked shots (10), averaged 6.2 ppg.

The Lady Rebs, however, will miss their co-captains from a year ago. Team leading scorer Penny Welsh (19.9 ppg) and four-year starter Sonia Lykes will leave a void that the rest of the team will try to fill. Welsh played in all but two games and shot 53% from the floor and 86% from the line. Lykes started in 20 games, shot an amazing 60% from the floor.

"They (Welsh and Lykes) were the team leaders," said Strike. "They were the tireless workers who kept everyone up in practice. Their replacements in those aspects won't be determined until we are into the season."

The Lady Rebs will be facing a more difficult schedule this year. Many of the early games are at home and much of the traveling is toward the end of the season. The coaches wanted this to allow the young players a chance to 'get their feet wet' before the tough opponents on the road.

Some of the games that will test the Lady Rebs this year include the season opener against Cal-Berkeley; Houston on Dec. 8; Arizona State in the Budweiser Round Robin Tournament in Jan.; LSU and Louisiana Tech in back-to-back road games Jan. 26 and 28; BYU in Feb.; and the Alaska Tournament featuring Texas and Florida State.

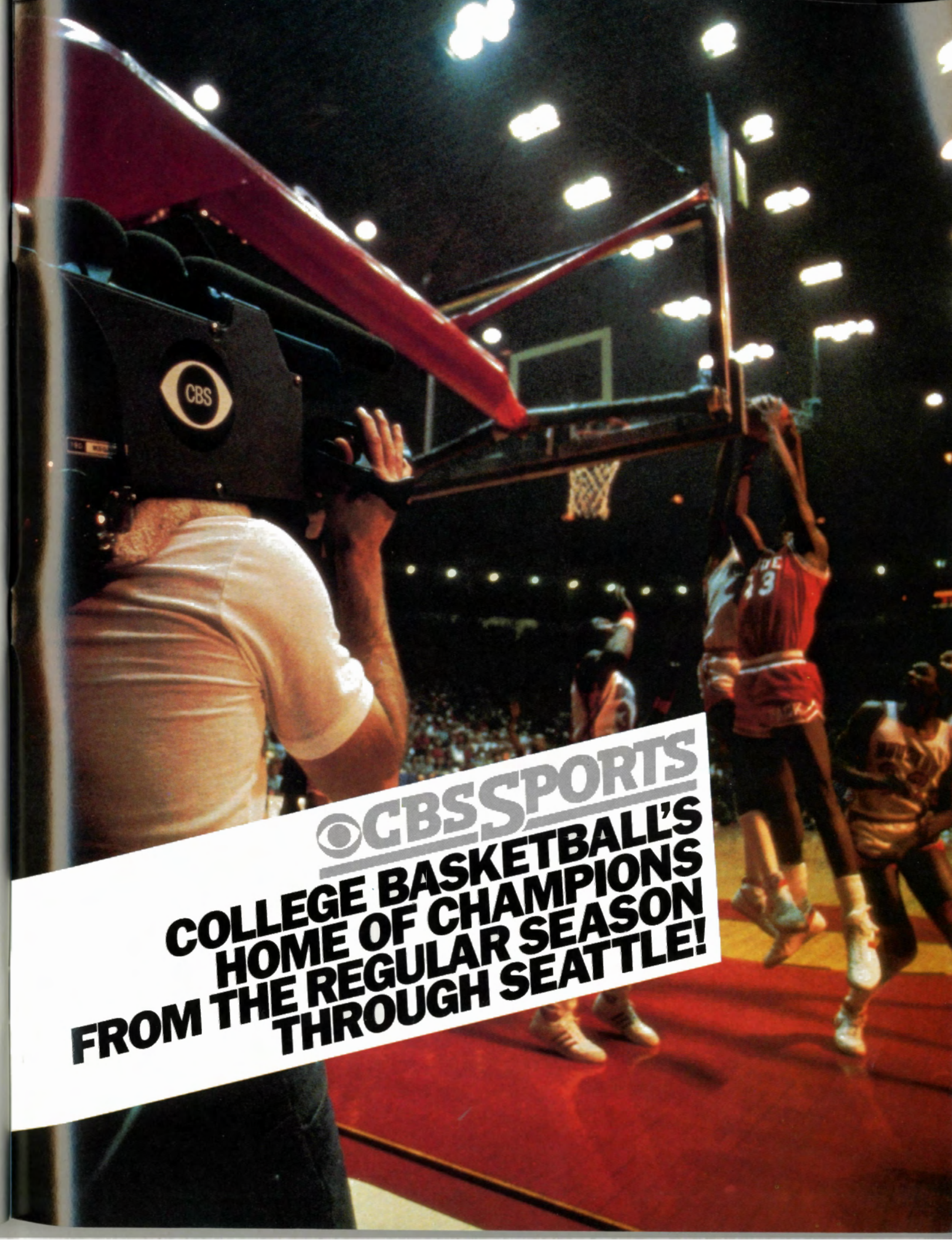

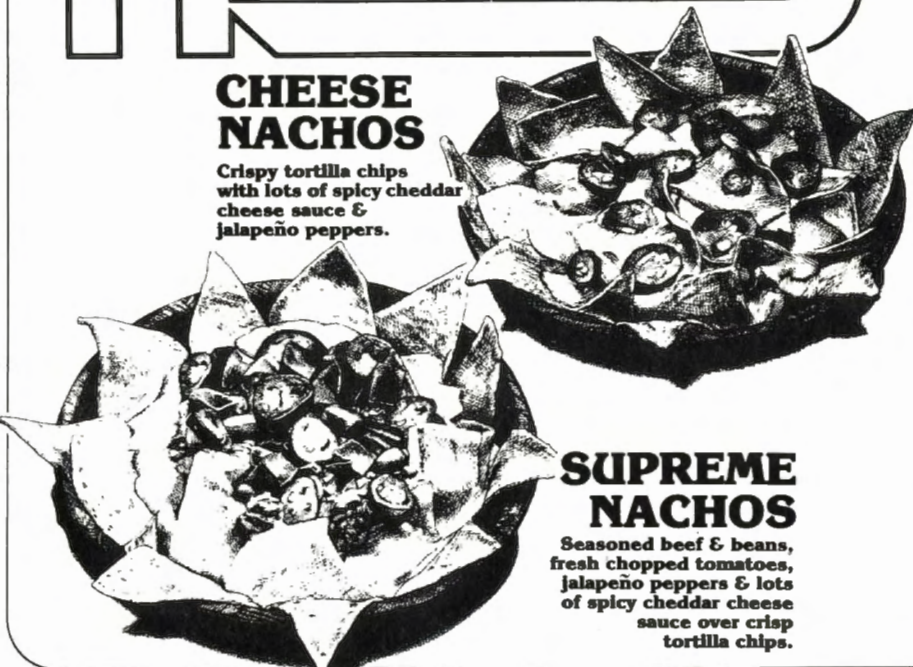

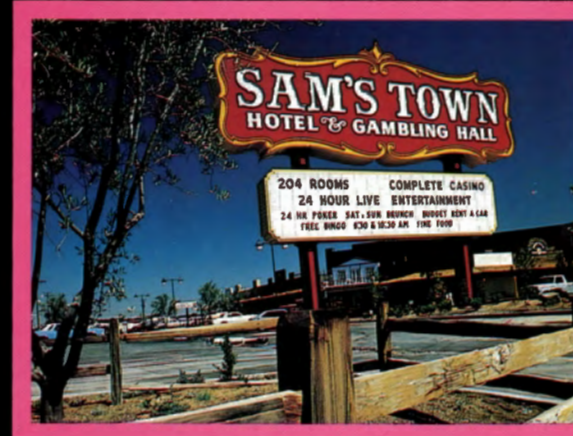
