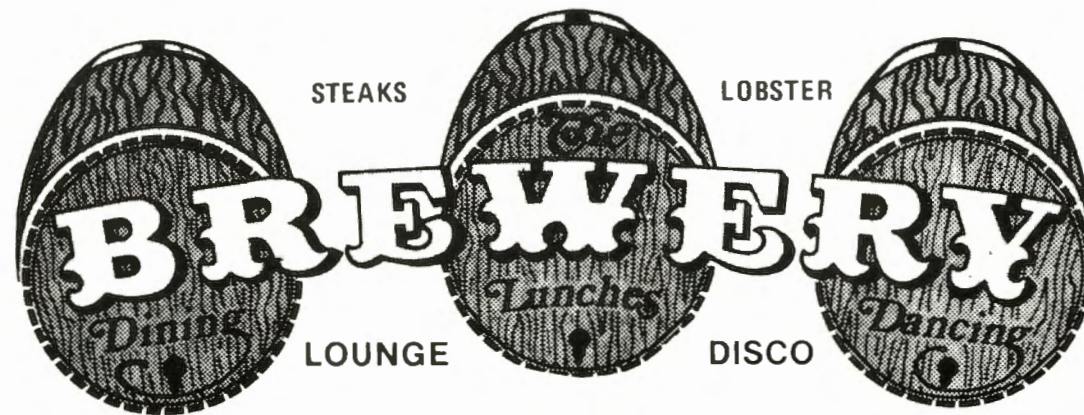

MEDIA INFORMATION

All requests for press and photo passes should be made either by letter or telephone at least one week in advance of the game. Visiting media are required to make their requests through their sports information director. Credentials will not be mailed. Credentials may be picked up the day before each game at the UNLV Sports Information Office or at the Will Call window the day of the game.

Requests for telephones should be directed through Central Telephone Company of Las Vegas Marketing Department (702) 385-1400. The UNLV Sports Information Office will not provide any courtside phones. Three phones on a first come, first served basis will be available after each game in the UNLV Sports Information Office.

Complete game statistics are provided at each Lady Rebel home game. They include team and individual stats, as well as half-time and quickie stats throughout the game.

Photo passes will be issued to only accredited media, as space limitations necessitate strict handling of photographers.

UNLV LOCKER ROOM POLICY

Lady Rebel post-game policies conform to NCAA efforts to assist news media in coverage of Lady Rebel Basketball. In 1982-83 the following rules will apply:

1. Head Coach Sheila Strike and her staff will be available for interviews 10 minutes after they have entered the locker room.
2. No cameras or television will be permitted in the dressing, shower or toilet areas. Post-game pictures and TV interviews will be allowed directly outside the locker room.
3. No members of the opposite sex are permitted in the dressing, shower or toilet areas of the Lady Rebel locker room. Players and coaches will be made available for interviews upon request.
4. No children are permitted in the post-game interview areas and in the locker room.
5. Parents and official visitors will be admitted approximately 20 minutes after the team enters the locker room or upon the coaches' discretion.

LAS VEGAS, THE UNIVERSITY

Las Vegas is known world-wide as an entertainment capital. But there is another side of the city which is gaining national recognition each year.

The University of Nevada, Las Vegas is a growing institution of higher learning. In less than ten years, UNLV has tripled its campus size, allowing room for the university's 63 different degree programs available to students, including over two dozen at the master's and doctoral levels.

Founded in 1957, UNLV has grown from a single one-story building in the desert to a green, 335-acre campus with a total head-count enrollment of approximately 11,000 (est.).

To accommodate the increasing enrollment, UNLV has undertaken a massive construction program which has brought millions of dollars worth of new buildings to the campus in the past decade.

These include one of the most modern teacher education facilities in the country, a major classroom and office building, a four-building physical education complex complete with a 50-meter indoor swimming pool, new laboratories and classrooms in the life sciences, and a spacious 2,000-seat concert hall which serves as a cultural home for the entire community.

A \$7 million, four-story addition to the James Dickinson Library opened in Fall 1981, providing better facilities and more room for the growing student body which requires expanded library holdings.

A generous gift from local attorney and businessman Artemus W. Ham, Jr., provided money for the new Alta Ham fine arts building, completed in April 1982. The \$4.2 million building will house teaching, research and studio facilities for the departments of theatre arts, music and art.

Ground was recently broken for a \$9 million facility to house both the College of Business and Economics and the College of Hotel Administration. Special features include enclosed patios and a kitchen and dining room for "hands-on" foodservice practice.

Ground has been broken on the 18,000-seat Thomas and Mack sports pavilion and continuing education complex. This building will serve as the new home for UNLV wrestling in 1983.

There are more than 400 faculty at UNLV today. They come from distinguished centers of learning — Berkeley, Harvard, Chicago, Princeton — and through their research and publications they are earning a fine academic reputation for UNLV in circles of higher education.

The College of Hotel Administration, for example, ranks among the finest programs of its type in the United States, and its graduates hold top management positions in hotels, restaurants and hospitals the world over.

The university's reputation in the sciences is growing, too, as it carries out research projects in such fields as desert ecology, environmental biology and geology, taking full advantage of UNLV's unique Southwestern desert setting.

The UNLV theatre arts department continues to earn regional and national awards for its outstanding dramatic productions, and music students are now earning credits playing behind the superstars of show business on the Las Vegas Strip.

Over the past several years, the UNLV Jazz Ensemble has garnered numerous awards in international competition. The group has traveled in Switzerland, Poland, the Orient, and most recently toured South America.

The university also has a progressive teacher education program, a growing nursing department and solid preparation for students in the social sciences, the humanities, business and economics.

UNLV also reaches out into the community through its aggressive continuing education program that last year enrolled 16,000 local residents — from housewives to business owners, graduates to four-year-olds.

The future is bright for UNLV as it begins its 25th year of service to Nevada through teaching, research and public service.

LAS VEGAS, THE CITY

First settled in 1855 as a missionary outpost of the Mormon Church, Las Vegas today has blossomed into a metropolis of more than 450,000 permanent residents. We have new parks, museums, churches, hospitals and libraries.

Our cultural scene is enriched by art galleries, legitimate theatres, a professional ballet company and numerous serious musical organizations. Las Vegas (Spanish for "The Meadows") is the seat of Clark County, located in the southern tip of Nevada, bordered by Arizona and the Colorado River on the east and California on the west. The Las Vegas metropolitan area is nestled in a 2,000-foot high desert valley surrounded by mountains that range in height from 5,000 to 12,000 feet.

UNLV PRESIDENT Dr. Leonard Goodall



Dr. Leonard Goodall is in his fourth year as the President of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

Goodall came to UNLV from the University of Michigan-Dearborn in July of 1979, where he was the school's chancellor. Previously, he served as associate dean of faculties and vice chancellor at the University of Illinois at Chicago Circle.

From 1962 to 1967, Dr. Goodall worked as assistant director and later as director of the Bureau of Government at Arizona State University.

He received his bachelor of arts degree in social science from Central Missouri State College in 1958. He earned his master of arts in political science from the University of Missouri in 1960 and a doctorate in political science from the University of Illinois in 1962.

Goodall is the author of three books, *Urban Politics in the Southwest*, *The American Metropolis* and *State Politics and Higher Education*. He has also written numerous monographs and articles in scholarly journals.

He and his wife, Lois, have two daughters and a son.

1982-82 Season Prospectus

Head Coach Sheila Strike's 1982-83 Lady Rebel Basketball squad will seek to regain national respect this year when the season gets underway, Saturday, November 27 at 11:00 a.m. in the Las Vegas Convention Center against Fresno State University.

UNLV, which finished it's season at 13-16 last year, has undergone a complete face-lift under the third year Strike (25-28 career mark) and optimistically has a chance at a national ranking early in the year. Six returning letterwinners anchor a young team which features seven first-year Lady Rebels, among them, junior college All-America guard Rochelle Oliver and freshman Donya Monroe, a Parade Magazine High School first-team All-America last season.

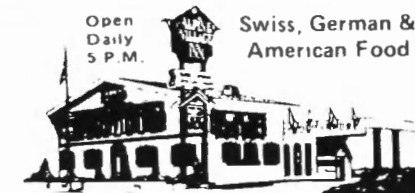
Never has UNLV had more height in it's lineup either. Freshman Tara Garlepp, a 6-5 center is expected to contribute to this year's squad immediately as are freshmen Stacy Green, 6-4, and Jackie Tefft, also 6-4. In addition, the Lady Rebels have five other athletes 6-0 and over, including Monroe (6-2), junior Lori Arent (6-4), sophomore letterman Valerie Juick (6-1), junior letterman Puala Clear (6-0), and senior letterman Jennifer Webb (6-0). Strike will also have more height in the backcourt this year with the addition of Misty Thomas from Windsor, Ontario (5-11). Thomas will see action behind three year letterwinner Sonia Lykes, a rocket-quick guard (5-4) who has been perhaps the most consistent Rebel over the past three season. Guard Penny Welsh (5-10) returns for her second season with the UNLV program and judging by last year's performance, her competition for a starting berth will have to wrestle the spot away. UNLV's other returning letterwinner, sophomore Kathy Acor (5-11) saw limited action last season, but one year's experience should help considerably.

"We have perhaps more talent this year than I've seen in a long time," commented Strike, "We've got good depth which is going to be important this year because of our schedule. With our slate being as difficult as it is, we should know by the first ten games of the season just how good we are."

The Lady Rebel's 1982-83 home schedule includes dates with three-time defending national champion Louisiana Tech, nationally ranked U. of Mississippi in the UNLV Desert Classic, and many other schools which figured to be nationally ranked.

THE COACHES



SHEILA STRIKE Head Coach

Sheila Strike begins her third season with the Lady Rebels, compiling a 25-28 record in her first two seasons as a collegiate boss. With an outstanding recruiting year in 1982, Strike hopes to rebound UNLV into the national limelight this season. Landing such players as JC All-America Rochelle Oliver and high school sensations Donya Monroe and Tara Garlepp. Strike could look forward to one of the most promising Lady Rebel seasons in history.

Since coming to UNLV, Strike has assembled an outstanding staff and has implemented a year-round training program for the Lady Rebels. After her first two seasons, Strike is only now reaping the benefits from the programs she has introduced at UNLV.

Prior to joining the Lady Rebs, Strike was an assistant at the University of Oregon for two seasons. Before that, Strike coached the girls' varsity at North Delta High School in Delta, British Columbia and the JV's at Simon Fraser University in Burnaby, British Columbia.

As a player, Strike played on the Canadian National Team for four seasons as an undergraduate, traveling across four continents competing with some of the finest players in the world. The Canadian native played in the World Student Games in Moscow, the Pan AM Games in Mexico, the World Championships in Cali, Columbia as well as a trip to China and several tours of Europe. In college, Strike led Laurentian University to the Canadian Collegiate Championship in 1974.

Strike received her B.A. from Laurentian (Sudbury Ontario) in 1975, and has received her master's degree in Sociology of Sport and Athletic Administration.



DAN PENCE Assistant Coach

If the Lady Rebels needed a "Psych" coach, Dan Pence would be the man. One of the top players to come out of Phoenix, Arizona Central High School, Pence has spent the past 6 years exploring the sociological imbalance of gender roles. Particularly culture.

All this adds to his talents as a working coach, talents which were developed beginning as a player at the University of Southern California and then the University of Arizona.

Besides "in the gym" coaching responsibilities, Coach Pence is in charge of the Lady Rebels' recruiting for the western part of the country, a job which utilizes his sociological expertise as well as his basketball knowledge.

Coach Pence received his B.A. in History at the University of Arizona in 1969 and completed his work on a Masters of Arts in Sociology at UNLV this past spring. His high school playing days landed him All-City, All-State, and Honorable Mention All-American honors. Dan is in his 2nd year at UNLV.



JIM BOLLA Assistant Coach

Professional playing experience is brought to the Lady Rebel coaching staff by Assistant Jim Bolla. Jim spent a season with the Cannon team in Venice, Italy and later was a member of a team of American professionals who toured South America. His transition into the coaching profession took place at his alma-mater, the University of Pittsburgh.

Beginning as a graduate assistant for both the men's and women's programs at Pitt, Coach Bolla became the rebounding specialist for the Panthers. The results were impressive...at the end of the '79 season the Pitt men were #3 on the NCAA's rebounding charts and at the end of the '80 season the women were 7th according to the AIAW. He was a full-time assistant for the Pitt women's team before coming to UNLV.

Coach Bolla was captain for the Panthers in 1975 when they made the field for the NIT. The previous season he helped Pitt make the NCAA field. Like Coach Pence, Coach Bolla was a high school All-America while playing for Pittsburgh's Canevin High, the 1969 Pennsylvania state champions.

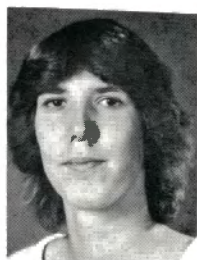

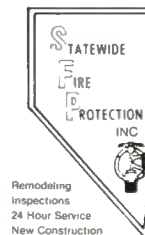

TINA KUNZER

Coordinator of Women's Athletics

The 1982 academic year marks Tina Kunzer's second year as UNLV's Coordinator of Women's Athletics. In this position she coordinates all women's athletic events, community fund raising and represents the university at national and regional meetings as well as other related duties.

Kunzer is the first to hold the position of Coordinator of Women's Athletics at UNLV. During the 1981-82 season, she established the first fund-raising campaign for women's athletic's at UNLV—the Lady Rebels' Boost-Hers Club.

Taking over as head coach of the UNLV women's tennis program in 1978, Kunzer became involved in several areas of the UNLV athletic program, including two years as a graduate assistant in the Physical Education Department from 1977-79.

Since 1977, she has served as the consultant to the UNLV cheerleaders.

Kunzer, a native of Las Vegas, is a 1975 graduate of UNLV and earned a masters in education at UNLV in 1977.

DENNIS FINFROCK

Assistant Athletic Director

As Assistant Athletic Director at UNLV, Dennis Finfrock is in charge of team travel arrangements for football and men's basketball teams, home events management and a variety of other administrative duties. Prior to his current position, he was the Rebels wrestling coach from 1977-81.

Under Finfrock's direction, the Rebel wrestling program was extremely successful. In his first season, 1976-77, he led the squad to a 19-2 record. He followed that with seasons of 16-9, 18-5 and 12-6 in 1979-80. His overall dual wrestling record at UNLV was 65-22, for a fine winning percentage of .747.

A graduate of Brigham Young University, with a bachelor of science degree in zoology, Finfrock has been involved in wrestling since 1963 and has helped promote high school wrestling in Las Vegas since 1970. He was an assistant wrestling coach at Rancho High School in 1970 and three years later moved to Chapparral High School to become head coach. He organized the Southern Nevada Wrestling Federation in 1973. Since then, membership in that organization has grown to over 700 members. Finfrock is also the former Nevada State chairman of the United States Wrestling Federation.

Finfrock was a Junior College Conference wrestling champ and also doubled in football, where he earned first team All Conference honors. As a senior at BYU, he earned Honorable Mention All WAC as a defensive end. A standout in the classroom, Finfrock had a 3.7 grade point average and was a member of the WAC All Academic team.

He received his master's degree in 1974 from Northern Arizona University.

Born in Dayton, Ohio, he was raised in Yuma, Ariz., where he met his wife, Kay. They are the parents of a son, Jason, 14.

DR. WAYNE PEARSON

Associate Athletic Director

Involved fulltime with the UNLV Athletic Department since 1971, Dr. Wayne Pearson is the Rebel's Associate Athletic Director and Director of Athletic Fund-Raising.

Pearson is the coordinator of the annual fund-raising program which last year brought in \$2 million for the UNLV athletic program.

Pearson's impact on both the UNLV Athletic Department, the University and the State of Nevada are diverse. He was a member of the Nevada State Gaming Control Board from 1967-69. He is the sole proprietor of Nevada Research Consultants — specializing in market research, business surveys, public opinion surveys and special consulting to advertising agencies and business firms. He is a member of the board of directors of the Dunes Hotel and Casino Corp.

Pearson is on the five-person Board of Psychological Examiners for the state, a post he had held since 1970 and he is past president of the Nevada Psychological Association. He was also chairman of the ad hoc committee of the University's Board of Regents whose function was to start a marching band for the UNLV athletic program. That committee first met in December 1977, and UNLV had its first marching band in 1980.

Born in East Ely, Nev., Pearson is a graduate of White Pine High School in Ely. He received both his bachelor's and master of arts degrees in general psychology from Nevada-Reno. He got his undergraduate degree in 1952 and his masters in 1957, following a two-year stint in the Army.

Pearson obtained his Ph.D. in educational psychology and measurement from Cornell University in 1960.

He is a member of Phi Kappa Phi national honor society.

JACKIE NEWTON

Academic Counselor

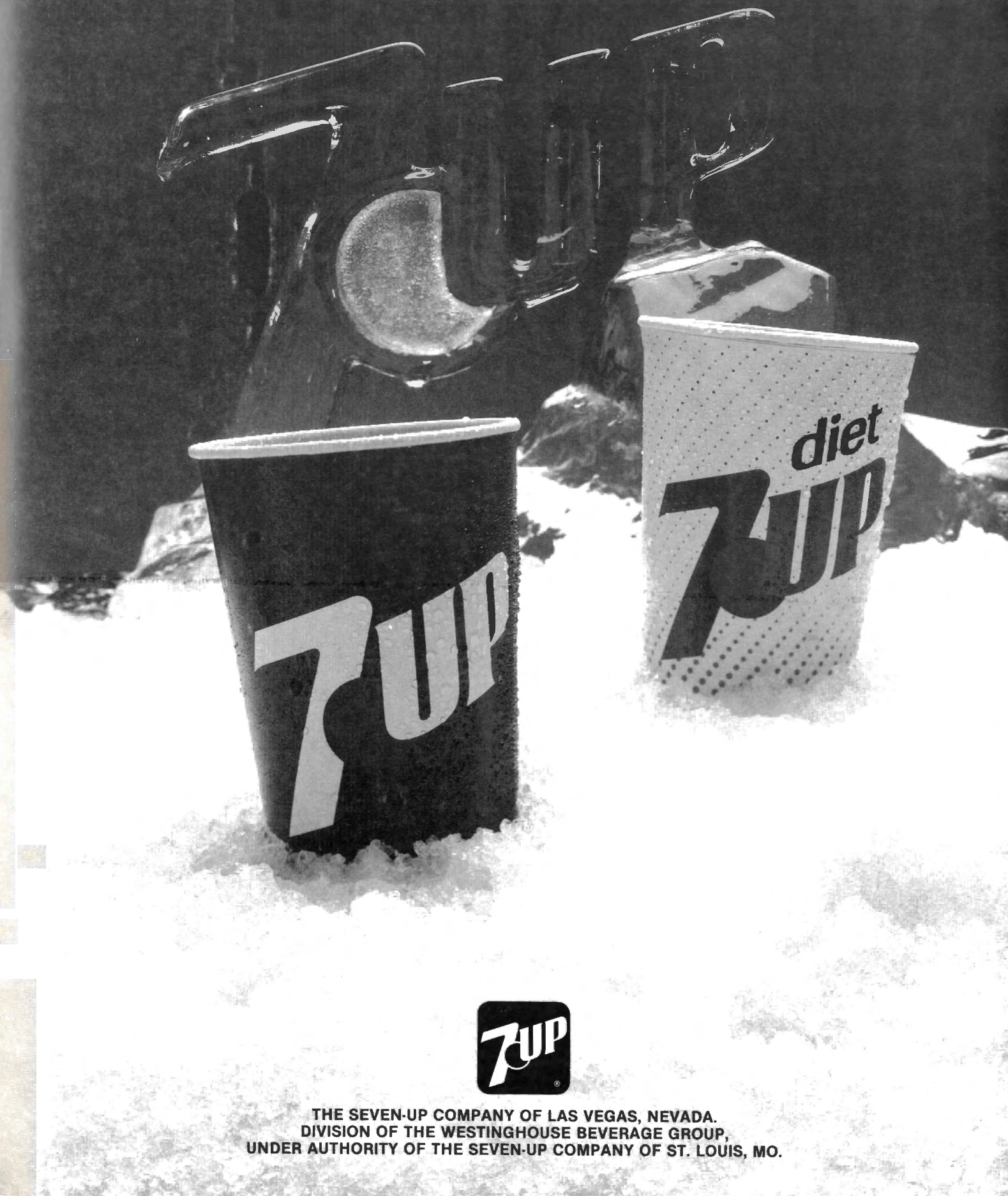
UNLV's emphasis on the importance of academic success for each athlete is underscored by establishment of an Athletic Academic Counselor's office several years ago. The position is currently held by Jackie Newton, a transplanted Sooner from Oklahoma City and the University of Oklahoma.

Officially, the primary function of Newton's office is to advise all intercollegiate athletes, scholarship or non-scholarship, in addition to or in lieu of other advisory opportunities on campus.

Unofficially, Jackie Newton makes it her personal goal to oversee the scholastic progress of the athletes and ensure they take full advantage of the educational opportunities available.

Newton received her Bachelor of Business Administration degree from the University of Oklahoma in 1962 and then returned to the campus at Norman 10 years later and added a Master of Education degree. While working on her Masters she served as a Financial Aid Counselor at Oklahoma and then, just prior to receiving her degree, became an Academic Counselor for the Sooners. She remained in that position until coming to UNLV.

A mother of two teen-age sons, Jackie has been very active in many civic and professional organizations including Big Brothers and the Urban League.
