1985-86 SEASON OUTLOOK  
TWO-TIME PCAA CHAMPIONS

Oh, how times have changed. Three seasons ago, the UNLV Lady Rebel Basketball team — boasting an excellent 24-4 overall record — was overlooked by the NCAA selection committee due to their independent status. This season, however, the Lady Rebels will attempt to earn their third consecutive NCAA bid and defend their conference crown in one of the strongest and up-and-coming leagues in the country.

It appears that the times will continue to change for the better because the 1985-86 outlook is brighter than ever. All five starters return — including several other letter winners — from last year's 26-5, PCAA Championship team. Throw in a fine recruiting class and the Lady Rebels are primed for the new challenge that awaits them.

"Winning the conference title will be tougher this year than it has been in the past, but I think that we are capable of regaining the title," Co-Head Coach Jim Bolla said. "We're going into this year with the attitude that we are the champions and people are going to have to work very hard to dethrone us. I think the new teams in the conference will help, I think we'll start to develop rivalries."

The PCAA has changed drastically since its beginning two years ago. At this time, the conference only had three members — UNLV, University of California Santa Barbara, University of California Irvine. Two additional teams, University of Hawaii and University of the Pacific, joined the PCAA last year. This year, the conference has grown to eight teams with the addition of San Diego State University, California State Fullerton and perennial power California State Long Beach. The PCAA Conference is now eligible for an automatic bid for post-season NCAA playoff action.

"The strength of the conference will now give us instant credibility and in the past people have doubted us," Bolla explained. "Six out of the eight teams in our conference had 20 wins or better last season. I think we'll have the best conference in the West and one of the strongest in the country. The consensus of the coaches in the conference is that three or four teams could qualify for NCAA's next year."

The top returnee for the Lady Rebels is All-America candidate Misty Thomas. Thomas was the leading Lady Rebel scorer (20.4ppg), rebounder (7.5rpg) and assists leader (6.4apg) last season. Among the honors she was bestowed with were: Kodak All-District VIII, PCAA Player of the Year, CoSIDA Academic All-America, first team All-PCAA, 7-UP Desert Classic All-Tournament Team and MVP of the Golden Bear Classic. Although Thomas suffered a knee injury at the end of the last season, she is expected to be healthy for the 1985-86 campaign.

Adding experience and leadership to this year's squad will be three year letter winner Donya Monroe. Monroe ended last season as the third leading scorer (12.4ppg) and rebounder (6.3rpg). She was named first team All-PCAA and was named to the Budweiser All-Tournament Team.

"Both Misty (Thomas) and Donya (Monroe) have been here for four years and have provided much leadership," Bolla said. "But we have younger players, like Karen (Hall) and Zina (Harris), who also show leadership."

Harris is another returning Lady Rebel starter. She led the squad in steals with 72 total thefts and was the fourth leading scorer (10.9ppg).

"Zina did an excellent job for us last year," Bolla explained. "Going from a center in high school to a point guard in college is a big move to make and she did it well."

Angela Christian, the 1984-85 Lady Rebels second leading scorer (13.0ppg) and rebounder (7.1rpg), will return to defend her starting forward position. Starter Kathy LaVern returns for her senior year with the Lady Rebels. LaVern ended the season leading the team in blocked shots with 30.

After nursing a knee injury last year, Karen Hall returns healthy this season. Her fine ball handling ability will enable her to receive extensive time at the point guard spot. Adding depth to both the forward and guard positions will be senior Kris Stiver.

Eligible for play this year is Junior Toni Sims. Sims transferred from the University of Oklahoma where she earned Big Eight Player of the Week honors in 1983.

The Lady Rebels' recruiting class is filled with talent and height this season. Kim Crawford, 6-1, out of San Luis Obispo, CA, will add depth and talent to the forward position. Another fine freshman forward is Shari Netzel. Netzel was named All-CIF and All-Conference last year at Culver City High School.

The center position will be bolstered with the addition of 6-4, Cathy Watlet. Watlet tallied 20 points and 11 rebounds as a senior at San Gabriel High School in Arcadia, CA.

Height, or the lack of it, was a bit of a problem on last year's squad. But the Lady Rebels have more than made up for the lack of height with the addition of a set of identical 6-3 twins, Allison and Diane Dickson. They will enter

UNLV as juniors after transferring from Howard County Junior College in Texas.

"We'll be really big this year," Bolla explained. "We'll still be able to get up and down the court very fast and we're going to stay with the same game plan. We'll still try to have balanced scoring with four or five players scoring in double figures."

For the past three years, the Lady Rebels have achieved 24 wins or better. With that superb success rate, the Lady Rebels are not about to change their strategies or tactics.

"The group of players have been here in the past and have been successful, we hope to continue the tradition," Bolla emphasized. "A lot of the players have experienced the winning end for three straight seasons. They know what winning is all about and they know what it takes to get there."

"The team has matured a lot in the past few years," Bolla continued. "The players have matured from year to year. Just look at Donya (Monroe). When Misty (Thomas) went down last year, Donya stepped right in and became the leader when we needed it. She inspired us and settled the team down when it was needed."

Another philosophy the Lady Rebels have maintained throughout the changing years is with the flexibility of players. Several players on the Lady Rebel team can play two, if not three, positions.

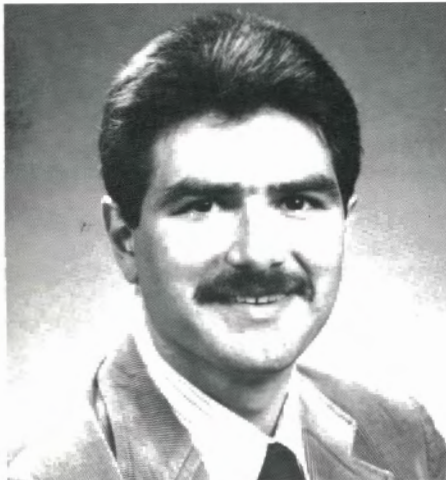
"Last year we had a rash of injuries which we had no control over," Bolla said. "We did our best with the situation we were in, that's why we need flexibility. That has been our philosophy in the past to make our players flexible. We'll have a couple of players who will be one position players, but the majority will be flexible."

Yes, the times have indeed changed and will continue to change in the future. But with the dedication, hard work and enthusiasm the Lady Rebel Basketball team has displayed in the past, the times should continue to change for the better.





# 1984-85 PCAA Co-Head Coaches of the Year

For Co-Head Coach Jim Bolla, achieving goals is not a new strategic coaching scheme, it is more a way of life.

As a prepster, Bolla did not pick up a basketball until the age of 15, however, he developed into one of the most highly sought after players in the state.

As a collegiate player, Bolla and his freshmen teammates vowed to take their team to a tournament in their senior year. He went to the NCAA's as a junior.

The achievements continue to grow for Bolla who is entering his fifth season with the Lady Rebels. Last year, Bolla's third season assuming the duties of co-head coach, he helped compile a 26-5 record and a second straight PCAA title in as many years. He and his wife, Co-Head Coach Sheila Strike-Bolla were awarded PCAA Co-Head Coaches of the Year for the second straight season.

Bolla entered the world of basketball at Canavin High School in Pittsburgh. As a 6-0 freshman, he had about as much interest in basketball as he did in American diplomatic policies until his homeroom teacher, who doubled as the basketball coach, asked him to try out. "I never played basketball before ninth grade," Bolla said. "I was getting beat 21-0 in one-on-one."

After a year's experience and a summer growth spurt which added four inches to his frame, Bolla became a starter. Canevin

amassed a perfect 24-0 record, complete with a Pennsylvania State Championship crown. Bolla's senior year he was named All-State, All America and played in the prestigious Dapper Dan Classic in Pittsburgh.

Bolla was highly recruited by several top notch schools including Maryland, Fordham and George Washington. He elected to stay closer to home and chose the University of Pittsburgh.

"I didn't want to go to a program that was already great," Bolla explained. "I wanted to go to a school where I could make an impact."

When Bolla came to Pitt in 1970 several other local Pittsburgh stars joined him. "They had a press conference when we signed with Pitt," he said. "We all made the commitment that we would take Pitt to a tournament when we were seniors."

Bolla saw much playing time as a frosh and started as a sophomore. Through hard work and dedication Bolla's goals were being fulfilled on almost a daily basis; that is, until December 12, 1971. While chasing a loose ball, he dislocated and broke his elbow while playing against South Carolina. "There really was not that much sports medicine or physical therapy then, so I had to rehabilitate it on my own."

As a player, Bolla believed in two things, hard work and aggressiveness. He has broken his nose five times and has been taped "from head to toe" at one time or another.

"We never really had any conditioning or weight lifting programs," Bolla said. "The way we improved was by playing basketball all year round. We used to go into the Pitt Field House in the summer at 6:00 p.m. and lock the doors and play for two or three hours."

Bolla and his teammates fulfilled their promise in 1974 when they tallied 22 straight wins and received a bid to the NCAA Tournament. His team advanced to the final eight, the furthest any Pitt team has ever advanced in NCAA competition only to be knocked out by North Carolina State.

He was named co-captain his senior year and helped guide his team to the NIT Championship tournament.

After graduation, Bolla stayed with the Pitt Basketball program as a volunteer assistant under then Pitt Head Coach and present

Runnin' Rebel Assistant Coach Tim Grgurich. He became a graduate assistant for the Panthers in 1977.

Bolla's indoctrination in the world of women's basketball came in 1979 when he was appointed Pitt's assistant women's basketball coach. While coaching the Lady Panthers, Bolla concentrated mainly on defense and rebounding. The Lady Panthers finished third in the nation in rebounding in 1980.

Bolla temporarily dropped out of the coaching world in 1981 to work for the Eastern Eight Basketball Conference. He worked in the advertising department and was the Eastern Eight official photographer for the 1981 season.

Bolla came to UNLV as an assistant coach for the Lady Rebels in 1981. He was promoted to Co-Head Coach in 1982.

Bolla, a native of Pittsburgh, earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Health and Physical Education from the University of Pittsburgh in 1975. He enjoys photography, and devoting time to his Old English sheep-dog Alfie.



The Lady Rebel Basketball program has flourished under Co-Head Coach Sheila Strike-Bolla. Within the past five years the team has amassed an excellent 99-44 record, including three straight seasons of 20 wins or more. Two years in a row, the Lady Rebels captured the PCAA conference title and received bids to the NCAA National Tournament.

Yet, through all the accomplishments the Lady Rebels have procured in the past five years, Strike-Bolla remains modest.

"I think we have now laid the groundwork in terms of a quality women's basketball program," Strike-Bolla said. "Our goal now will be to attract quality people year in and year out."

Quality. It is a goal that Strike-Bolla has strived for as an athlete, a student and a coach. Her emphasis on quality was first evident when she embarked in the world of basketball in her native city of Vancouver, British Columbia.

"I come from an academically oriented family," Strike-Bolla said. "My mother is a high school principal and my sister was class valedictorian and an honor student through college. Sports was a way for me to avoid challenging her and still seek advancement."

Strike-Bolla however, excelled enough academically to graduate early in order to play for Simon Fraser University in Burnaby, British Columbia. Her 6-2 slender frame and gifted athletic ability soon made her one of Canada's most prominent women's basketball players.



Although Strike-Bolla was an outstanding prepster, she did not receive any formal basketball training until 1972 when she earned a spot on Canada's Olympic squad. Although most athletes consider making their country's national team the culmination of an athletic career, Strike-Bolla states that it was just a matter of being in the right place at the right time.

"When I first made the Olympic team," Strike-Bolla said, "it was not a long sought-out goal. A friend got me a try-out and they just happened to need a center at the time."

As a member of Canada's national women's basketball team for four years, Strike-Bolla had the opportunity to travel to all points on the globe for international competition. Her team competed in the Pan American Games, held in Mexico City in 1974, the World Student Games, held in Moscow in 1973, and was one of the first international teams to travel to China when they opened their doors in 1972. All in all, Strike-Bolla has visited 21 countries through international basketball competition.

"I don't remember most of the scores or even some of the places we traveled to," Strike-Bolla said. "But I'll always remember things like coming out of the arena in China and seeing 10,000 bicycles, seeing the marching military formations in Russia and seeing a baby growing up in a cardboard box on the streets of Bogota, Columbia. It was those kinds of cultural experiences that I'll remember the most from international competition."

The highlight of Strike-Bolla's playing days occurred in 1976 when she once again represented Canada in the Montreal Olympics. "Making the squad in 1976 was a major goal," she said. "Competing in the Olympic games in my home country was just the epitome of what every amateur athlete strives for... it was just spectacular."

After Strike-Bolla received her BA in Geography from Laurentian University and her teaching certificate from Simon Fraser University in 1977, she began her extensive coaching career. Her first coaching stint was coaching the junior varsity team at her alma mater Simon Fraser in 1976-77. She then spent one year at the high school level as the head coach of North Delta Senior High School Girls Basketball team.

In 1978 Strike-Bolla accepted an assistant coaching position at the University of

Oregon, where she stayed for two seasons. She served as the team's recruiter and landed several Canadian as well as American stars.

When the head coaching position opened at UNLV in 1980, Strike-Bolla applied with no serious intention of being considered. To her surprise, she was not only considered, but was offered the position. "Again, becoming a head coach was not really one of my grand goals, it was just something that I fell into," she stated. "However, I'm very glad I made the move to UNLV."

This will be the fourth season that she will be sharing the head coaching duties with her husband, Jim Bolla. Together they have compiled a 74-16 record through three seasons.

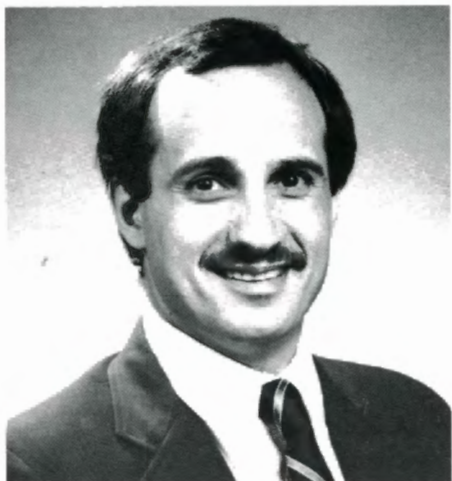

## Lady Rebel Assistant Coach Jerry Busone

Jerry Busone, entering his second season as assistant coach, has vast experience with successful women's basketball programs. He helped coach two national championship teams, one National Women's Invitational Tournament (NWIT) championship squad and brought a struggling collegiate program to height of respectability in two short seasons.

But the most valuable factor that Busone possesses is his philosophy towards winning. Unlike most coaches today, Busone theorizes that winning is truly not everything.

"You can't measure the success of a program by whether or not you earn a national title or go to the Final Four," Busone said. "Winning can't be the sole purpose — it is a result of doing a number of things right. You have to go one step at a time and keep growing. If you work hard enough and do everything right the wins will come."

Before coming to UNLV in 1984-85, Busone turned the University of Hawaii Women's Basketball program, which had not won more than eight games a season in its entire history, into a veritable island power.

His first season, 1982-83, Hawaii amassed 22-12 record and received an invitation to the NWIT Tournament —

the programs first ever post season tournament appearance.

But after two fruitful years in the island paradise, Busone decided to hang up his head coaching shoes and come to UNLV as an assistant. "I grew a lot in Hawaii," Busone explained. "I wanted to see what I was like as a head coach. Coming to UNLV was a good decision, it put my priorities in life back in order."

Prior to Busone's head coaching duties with the Rainbow Warriors, he served as an assistant at Old Dominion University for five years. He helped guide the Lady Monarchs to a NWIT Championship during his inaugural season in 1977-78.

Then in 1978-79, Old Dominion attained national prominence by capturing the NCAA National Championship trophy. Led by All-America Nancy Liberman, the Lady Monarchs repeated their championship performance in 1979-80 by winning their second national title.

During the two championship years, Busone helped coach what was called, "the greatest women's basketball team ever assembled on a court." In an exhibition game against Russia in 1979, this formidable squad came closer to beating the Soviets than any team did in 20 years. "That was the greatest game I was ever involved with," he said. "The Russians were not used to being behind in a game, and here we were on top until the final minutes. There were 11,000 screaming fans and American flags all over the place. . . it was a greater thrill than the two national championships."

Busone embarked in athletics while at LaSalle Institute in Green Island, New York. In high school he played basketball, football and ran track. He then went to Hudson Valley Junior College and played basketball and ran track. His last stop in his collegiate athletic career was at Santa Fe College where he played point guard on the school's basketball team.

Although Busone jests that he was "the kid nobody noticed on the floor," he was an expert at fundamentals. "I

had a good set of legs and was quick, but I was short so I had to perfect the little things. Too many athletes are worried about their 20 foot jump shots rather than perfecting the fundamentals."

Busone earned a BBA in Management at Santa Fe and a masters in education at Old Dominion. He also published an article in *Scholastic Coach* magazine in December 1979.

Busone, a native of Green Island, NY, is married to the former Lori Jensen and has one daughter, Carly Leileni, age 2½.



## Jaina Preston Academic Advisor

Jaina Preston, the Lady Rebels new academic counselor, brings to the program an outstanding record of success in advising and counseling. She has worked as both counselor and director of counseling in a variety of settings, usually with organizations specializing in treating the problems of adolescents. Most recently she has been the office manager and interim director of the local chapter of the National Conference of Christians and Jews. During this time she recruited several of the Lady Rebels as counselors for the NCCJ's annual summer camp, an experience that convinced her of the high quality and wide ranging abilities of UNLV's players.

Noted for a calm and direct approach in counseling she looks forward to the opportunities of her new position. "With the Lady Rebels I am dealing with individuals who are already achievers," Preston said. "One of the best parts of this job is seeing young women realize that their intellectual abilities respond to the same inputs as their athletic abilities. The harder they work the better they get. It is fun to see them really know that they can achieve in class as well as on the court."

As the Lady Rebels Academic Counselor, Preston is responsible for evaluating transcripts, making sure every player is progressing toward their degrees, making certain each player satisfies both University and degree requirements and overseeing each player's eligibility status. She works in conjunction with each player's faculty advisor to ensure academic progress is being made.

Preston is a 1977 graduate of Antioch where she received her B.A. in Psychology. She has three children—Eric (17), Sean (4), Erin (2). Her husband, Fred, chairs the Department of Sociology at UNLV.



## Jim Gemma Assistant Sports Information Director

Beginning his third year in the position of assistant SID, Jim Gemma lends the department a wealth of local experience. Gemma is a graduate of Bishop Gorman High School (1978) and earned his B.A. in Communication Studies at UNLV in 1982. Gemma has logged eight years as a student assistant and full time staff member. Gemma worked for five years for the UNLV Baseball program under the direction of Head Coach Fred Dallimore, before becoming a full time employee. Gemma has been responsible for covering women's basketball, men's and women's swimming and women's volleyball, in addition to his work with baseball. Gemma also assists with all major athletic events at UNLV. A member of the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and a member of the College Sports Information Directors of America (COSIDA), Gemma has also worked as official scorer for the Las Vegas Stars professional baseball team. He orchestrated the successful All-American campaign of UNLV point guard Misty Thomas, and published an article on Thomas in *Women's Basketball Weekly*.



# UNLV President Dr. Robert C. Maxson



Robert C. Maxson assumed his duties as president of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, on August 1, 1984. Before coming to UNLV, President Maxson served as the Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs at the University of Houston. In that capacity, he was the chief academic officer of the 45,000 student university. President Maxson earned his doctorate from Mississippi State University in 1970. His major areas of study and interest have

been higher education administration and social psychology. He has been particularly interested in the phenomenon of leadership in institutions of higher education. He has written two college text books which together have been adopted in approximately 100 universities. He also has written numerous articles which have been published in scholarly journals. President Maxson is married and lives with his wife Sylvia and their daughter Kimberly here in Las Vegas. Their son Todd is a senior at Texas A&M University majoring in bio-chemistry. President Maxson is tireless in the pursuit of his dreams for UNLV; no one works longer hours or harder ones than he does. Anyone familiar with his schedule knows he starts his day at 5:30 a.m. by running several miles and is in the office by 7:30 a.m. Most days do not end until late in the evening. It is not unusual for him to call a meeting of his senior staff members on weekends; he likes these meetings because, he says, "the telephone and appointment book don't interrupt us."

# Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Dr. Brad Rothermel



During the 1984-85 academic year, the University of Nevada, Las Vegas had each of its fifteen intercollegiate sports, with only three exceptions, represented in post-season, national competition. In addition, most of these teams were ranked nationally in the top 20 at one time or another. Much of the credit for this outstanding collegiate record goes to UNLV's Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Dr. Brad Rothermel. Rothermel, who now enters his sixth year as Athletic Director, has built UNLV Athletics to the point where the university is now very competitive at both the conference and national level.

Rothermel's philosophy while at UNLV has been that the function of the intercollegiate athletic program is to provide for the student-athletes an environment in which those student-athletes are able to pursue excellence in selected extra-curricular educationally related activities. Furthermore, his objective for the programs is to win within the structure of the rules and the budgetary framework provided. The achievement of this goal is demonstrated by successfully competing against national championship caliber competition in all activities sponsored by the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics. Prior to his appointment at UNLV in 1981, he was Associate Director and Business Manager for the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics at West Virginia University. From 1974 to 1976 he was employed as Assistant Director and Business Manager for the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics at Kansas State University. Rothermel supervised the intercollegiate athletic programs for men and women while serving as Director of the Health and Physical Education at George Williams College in Downers Grove, Illinois, from 1971 to 1974.

President Maxson has been single-minded in his efforts to recruit the best and brightest high school students in Nevada to the campus. He also has promoted the concept of the "Great Urban University." He believes UNLV can become a modern University, a University for the 21st century. He sees the potential for UNLV to achieve the status as one of the top urban universities in the country within the next 5 to 10 years. "There is absolutely no reason that we can't accomplish our goal of being a great urban university. We have the support of one of the finest communities in the country. We have a faculty that any president would envy, a student body of bright, hard-working young people, and a support staff that is second to none. In short, if we don't become a first rate urban university, it's just because we will have not worked hard enough." Anyone who knows Bob Maxson knows it won't be because he didn't work hard enough.

From 1965 to 1967, he served as Supervisor of Counseling and Research Development while functioning in the capacity of Assistant Athletic Director of the University of Illinois Athletic Association. Prior to that position he was an administrative associate and coach for the Chicago National League Baseball Club (Chicago Cubs). In addition to his above mentioned athletic positions, Rothermel has served as an administrator in numerous educational, recreational and financial environments. He also possesses coaching and experience as a competitor at all levels from elementary school through the professional ranks. Rothermel received his Ph.D. in 1965 and a M.S. degree in 1961 from the College of Applied Human Life Sciences at the University of Illinois, Champaign-Urbana. He received his B.S. from Northern Illinois University in 1960. Rothermel and his wife, Suzanne, a kindergarten teacher in the Clark County School district, have two daughters; Beth (16) and Christine (12).



# Charlotte Summers Assistant Athletic Director/Finance

Charlotte Summers begins her third year as UNLV's Assistant Athletic Director for Finance/ Athletic Business Manager. Her duties include the business and fiscal management for the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics, which involves eight men's and eight women's athletic programs and additional administrative responsibilities. 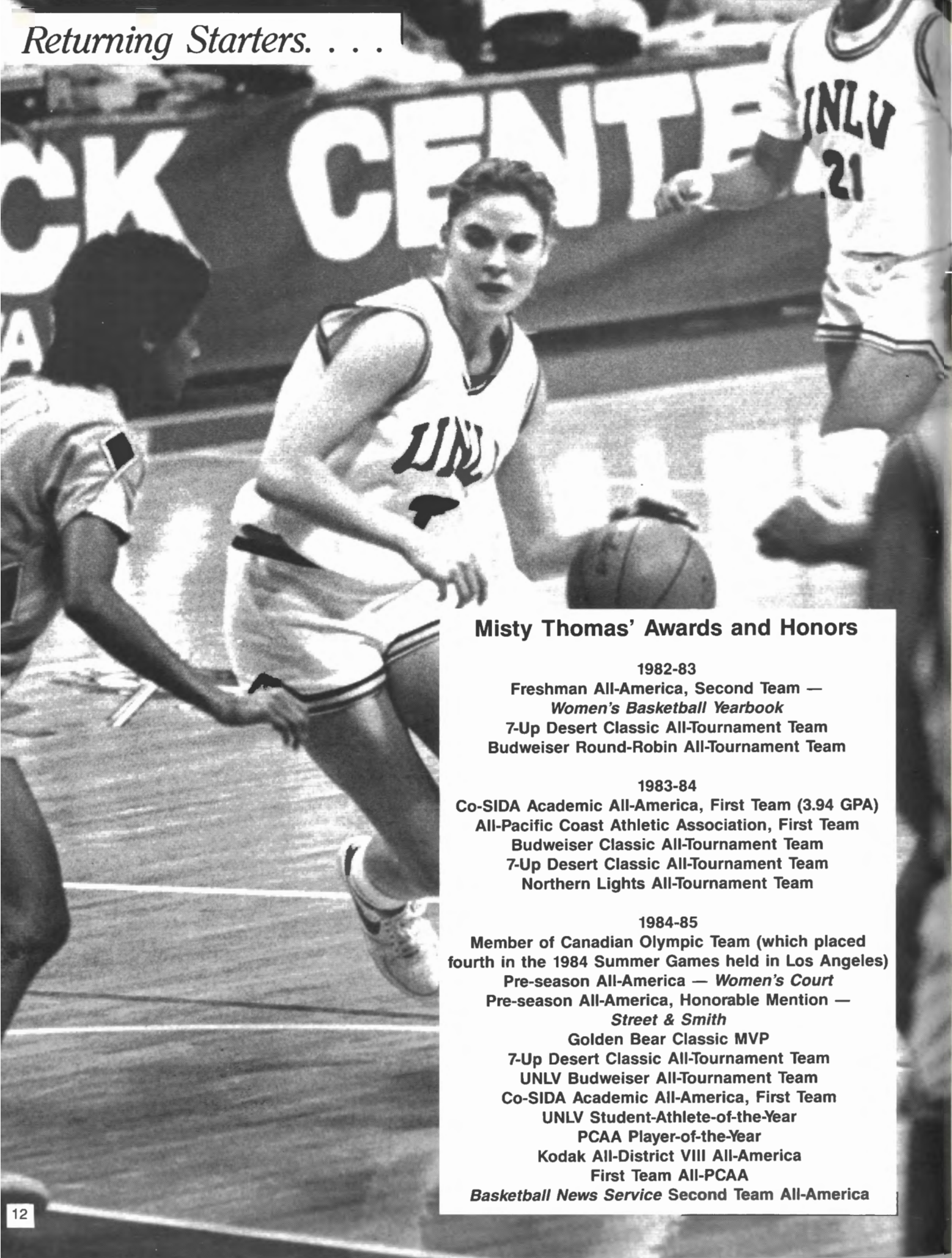

Although her achievements are numerous, her talents are countless and her contributions to the Lady Rebel Basketball program are almost immeasurable, two-time All-America Misty Thomas still labels herself as a "team player."

But what a team player Thomas is. Last year, for example, she led the Lady Rebels in every offensive category, scoring (20.4ppg), rebounding (7.5rpg) and assists (6.4apg). She was the leading scorer in 23 out of the 31 games played and helped guide the team to the NCAA National Tournament for the second consecutive year.

The 1984-85 season was a campaign filled with many highs and lows for Thomas. Her skills and leadership on the court helped her earn several distinctions, including: Kodak All-District VIII All-America team, PCAA Player of the Year, First Team All-PCAA, Golden Bear Classic MVP, 7-Up Desert Classic All-Tournament team and Basketball News Service second team All-America. Thomas' talents in the classroom earned her CoSIDA Academic All-America status for the second consecutive year — the second UNLV athlete ever to achieve such honors.

Thomas' low point of the 1984-85 season occurred in the first game of the PCAA Women's Basketball Championship Tournament. Only three minutes into the game Thomas went down with a severe knee injury. Although she was unable to play the rest of the season, she was on the road to recovery before the NCAA's.

During the past three seasons with the Lady Rebels, Thomas has distinguished herself as one of the West's finest players. As a freshman, she averaged 12.1 points per game and was named to the Women's Basketball Yearbook Freshman All-America (second team). As a sophomore, Thomas was the Lady Rebels second leading scorer (15.5ppg) and broke the season assists record (180). This past season, Thomas etched several new marks in the UNLV record books. She became UNLV's most prolific scorer by amassing 1,411 total career points, the UNLV field goal leader (550), the UNLV free throw leader (311) and UNLV assists leader (505).

"Her best quality is that she is a talented athlete," Co-Head Coach Jim Bolla said. "She shoots well, handles the ball well for her size and she can play all the positions. . . I think the best way to describe her is that she does a number of things well."

A unique quality that Thomas possesses is that she is a self motivator. She has an inner desire to excel that surpasses all other quests.

"She always wants to be the best and get the best out of her fellow teammates, Bolla explained. "She is definitely the hardest worker on our team. In her studies it is the same way — she wants to be the best she can be."

Not only is Thomas one of the best in the West, but she has established herself as one of Canada's premier women's basketball players. She was a member of the 1984 Canadian Olympic team that placed fourth in the Los Angeles Summer Games.

According to Bolla, Thomas' international playing experience will add another dimension to her already lengthy list of credentials.

"International competition is almost a completely different game," Bolla said. "It is a lot more physical and it motivates you to play your best on all occasions. She carries this style of play over to our games."

This season Thomas will once again be utilized more as a scorer. According to Bolla, "she is very unselfish. Many times she'll pass the ball away when it's her shot. . . it's just her nature."

As a prepster at Vincent Massey Secondary School, Thomas was a four-time All-City selection and was chosen Provincial All-Star, which is equivalent to All-America honors in the United States. She was also the recipient of the Arcanum Award, which is given to the Windsor student who best combines athletic skills and academic achievements.

Thomas is not the first member of her family to experience Olympic competition. Her father Paul, who is the basketball coach for the University of Windsor, was the youngest person ever to coach the Canadian Olympic Team in 1952.

She is majoring in Physical Education and Sports Medicine and has aspirations of attending medical school. Thomas' excellent grade point average currently stands at 3.94 out of a 4.0.

## THE THOMAS AND MACK CENTER

The \$30 million Thomas and Mack Center is the newest addition to the Entertainment Capital of the World, located in the heart of Las Vegas on the campus of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

Constructed with state-of-the-art engineering capabilities, the Center is an athletic and special events facility. It is the largest structure of its kind in the state of Nevada, and is the fourth largest on-campus arena in the United States.

The Center was specifically designed to handle a wide variety of athletic events-including basketball, wrestling, tennis, volleyball, gymnastics, soccer, hockey, ice skating and rodeo-but it is also perfect for such events as concerts, conferences, circuses and commencement exercises.

The most impressive feature of the facility is its 18,000 seat arena. Spectators have optimal sight lines from arm-chair seats in 51 rows on two tiers. Surrounding the arena is spacious, accessible concourse with 44,500 square feet of floor space, easily capable of providing capacity crowd movement, displays or trade shows. The Center's main floor has four expandable meeting rooms, another large meeting room, ticket offices, a restaurant with bar, press room, locker rooms and snack bars.

Overall, the Thomas and Mack Center is 251,450 square feet and is 2,027½ feet above sea level.

**Arena**-Floor-level retractable seating (9 rows) decreases seating by 2,000.

-Without seating retracted, floor measures 124 feet x 72

feet and has approximately 8,900 square feet of floor space.

-With seating retracted, floor measures 184' x 124' with approximately 22,500 square feet of floor space.

-The basketball surface is portable wood.

-Ceiling height is 127 feet.

-Approximately 1,500-2,000 chairs may be set up on the floor.

**Concourse**-Measures 34' x 1,300'

-44,500 square feet of floor space.

-Ceiling height varies from 13 feet at sides to 20 at peak.

-Thirty private luxury boxes-a total of 392 seats-are available for rental.

**Audio Visual Capabilities**-232 foot candles of metal halide light over every square foot of the area provide excellent television lighting.

-Television camera baskets are located on the concourse level and cameras may be set up on ground level.

-40,000 pounds, spread over eight points, can be hung from the arena ceiling.

**Parking**-41 acres for 5,500 cars.

**Ticket Booths**-2 main offices and 4 satellite offices.

**Locker Rooms**-Six locker rooms, each accommodating 15-20 people. One locker room for game officials.

**Scoreboards/Marques**-Two multipurpose scoreboards located at each end of the arena.

-Two animated message centers with graphic animation and line-oriented message capabilities are located at mid-court.



## THE BERT LEAVITT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

A donation in the name of Bert Leavitt was made in the Spring of 1983 to an endowment fund for women's basketball at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. An annual scholarship, the *Bert Leavitt Memorial Scholarship*, will be presented prior to the beginning of each season by Mrs. Joyce Leavitt to a member of the women's basketball team who meets the following criteria: 1) The recipient must be in either her junior or senior year of eligibility at the time of the scholarship; 2) The recipient must have an overall GPA of 3.0 for her college career; 3) The recipient will be chosen by the head coach (Mrs. Joyce Leavitt reserves the right to amend this item at her discretion); 4) In the event that no female basketball players meets all of the above-mentioned criteria in any given year, the award will be presented at the discretion of the head coach.

The recipient of the Bert Leavitt Memorial Scholarship shall receive monies from interest earned on the Bert Leavitt endowment up to the amount specified by NCAA as allowable over and above her basketball scholarship. Remaining monies that represent the balance of interest earned on the Bert Leavitt endowment shall be transferred into the women's basketball scholarship account.

The Bert Leavitt Memorial Scholarship recipient shall receive, in addition to scholarship monies, a small plaque to be provided through funds accrued from the endowment.

The interest earned on the first quarter, ending June 30, 1983, shall be used to purchase a large trophy, upon which names of successive recipients shall be added, to be displayed in the Thomas and Mack Center.

Lori Arent was the recipient of the Leavitt Scholarship last year. Misty Thomas will be the recipient this season. Thomas is a two-time Co-SIDA Academic All-America (first team).

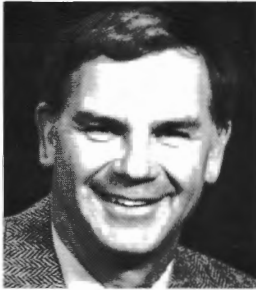

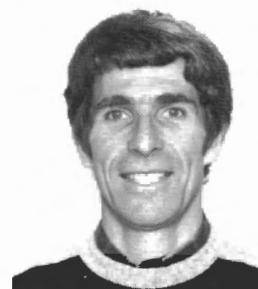

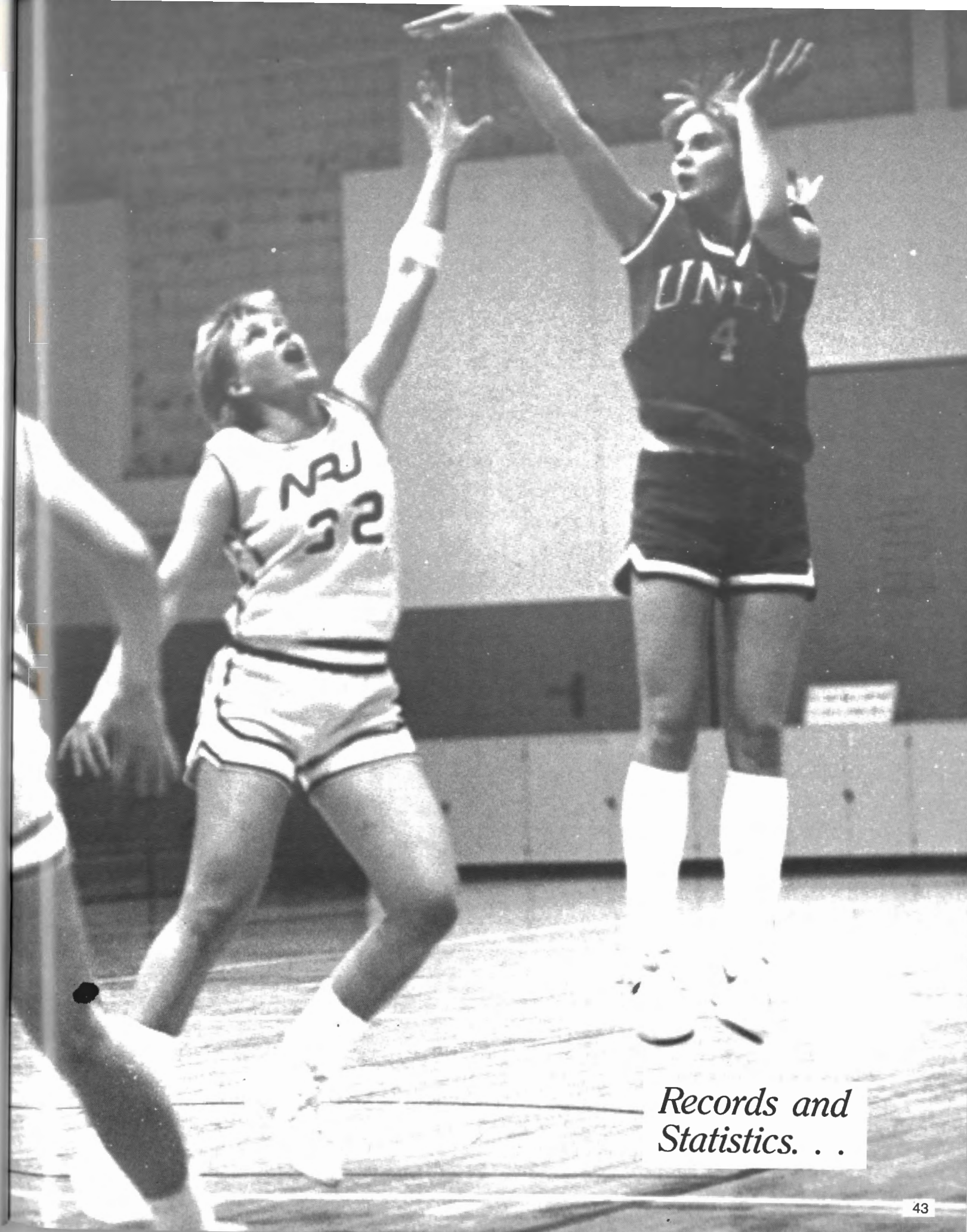

THE UNIVERSITY OF NEVADA, LAS VEGAS

The University of Nevada, Las Vegas was officially established in 1957 with the construction of Maude Frazier Hall on a 60-acre plot of desert. Through hard work and determination, civic leaders and community members helped form a center for academic excellence in Southern Nevada for generations to come. The University has never lost sight of that original mission.

Despite its short history, UNLV has seen dramatic growth in all areas. Fifty undergraduate programs and 29 graduate programs are now offered to over 11,000 students on a campus extending 335 acres in the heart of Las Vegas. All programs are fully accredited by the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges, and many programs have received further accreditation from independent national accrediting bodies.

Continual community support over the years has seen the number of buildings on campus increase to 28, and approval was recently granted to begin construction on a 101,000-square-foot facility to house UNLV's new School of Engineering and Computer Science. Both the school and the building are the direct result of local philanthropy.

With many major construction projects now completed, the University's administration continues to focus its resources on the essential elements of all great universities: its academic offerings, the faculty, its students.

More than 300 full-time professors serve the University, bringing degrees and teaching experience from leading universities around the world. Faculty members are involved in important research for government and public service agencies, for scholarly books and journals, and for their own enlightenment and knowledge. Many faculty have won major awards and fellowships, including the coveted Fulbright, for their work.

While most students are Nevada residents, a lively mixture of international and out-of-state students adds to the cosmopolitan quality of campus life.

The Las Vegas community is served by an ambitious Continuing Education Program at UNLV. Approximately 16,000 residents take part annually in more than 500 credit and non-credit courses for professional development or personal interest.

UNLV is a beautiful campus with facilities connected by spacious lawns and walkways which are shaded by mature trees and desert foliage. Just outside the campus are apartments, restaurants, shopping centers, libraries, hospitals, and all the other conveniences of an urban area.

The University is integral to the city's cultural scene. Dozens of musical, dramatic, dance, and artistic groups have been

formed under the auspices of the University and perform regularly for campus and community audiences. Each year a number of popular stage and screen performers and recording artists from every music category are featured in concert on the stages of the University's four events centers. With the recent opening of the Thomas and Mack Center and Sam Boyd Silver Bowl, family shows and sporting events also are staged for all Las Vegas to enjoy.

Many other campus activities are scheduled for students and the general public. The Consolidated Student government (CSUN) sponsors film series, lecture series, dances, intramural athletics, concerts, and the like throughout the year. CSUN also operates *The Yellin' Rebel* student newspaper and KUNV-FM, a non-profit radio station serving the Las Vegas valley.

The University has excellent sports facilities for use by students and the general public. The Paul C. McDermott Center has lighted tennis courts, playing fields, a 50-meter Olympic swimming pool, two gymnasiums, handball/ racquetball courts, dance studios, gymnastics and weight-training rooms, baseball and soccer fields, and a full-size track for jogging enthusiasts.

Other points of interest on campus include the following.  
**Museum of Natural History**—Permanent and traveling exhibits illustrate the biology, geology, and archaeology of the Southwest. The museum is open daily; there is no admission charge. 739-3381.

**Fine Arts Gallery**—Exhibits by faculty and invited artists, with an emphasis on modern art. Located in Alta Ham Fine Arts Building, room 130, the gallery is open weekdays free of charge.

**James R. Dickinson Library**—Features a book collection of 486,000 volumes; 5,500 periodical subscriptions; over 200,000 federal, state, and local documents; 669,000 microforms; and 27,000 non-book materials. A Special Collections department maintains a world-renowned collection on gambling and holdings on Nevadiana, menus, and university archives.

**The Flashlight**—A 38-foot-tall, 74,000-pound steel sculpture by internationally-acclaimed artist Claes Oldenburg stands on the plaza between Artemus W. Ham Concert Hall and Judy Bayley Theatre at the northern end of the campus's Academic Mall.

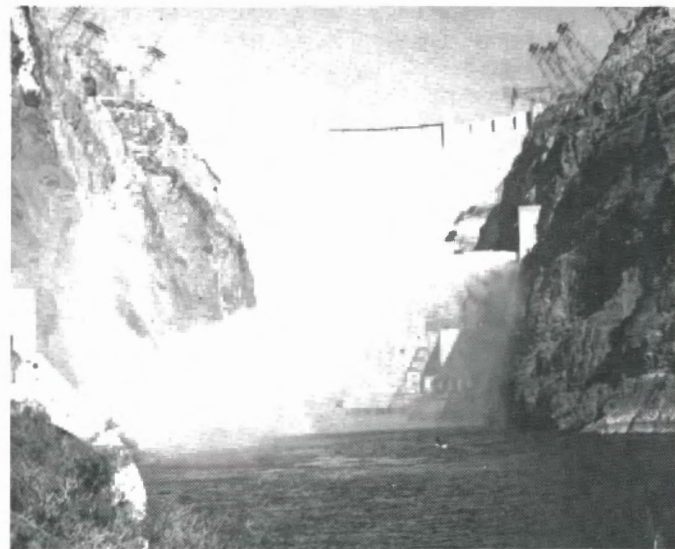
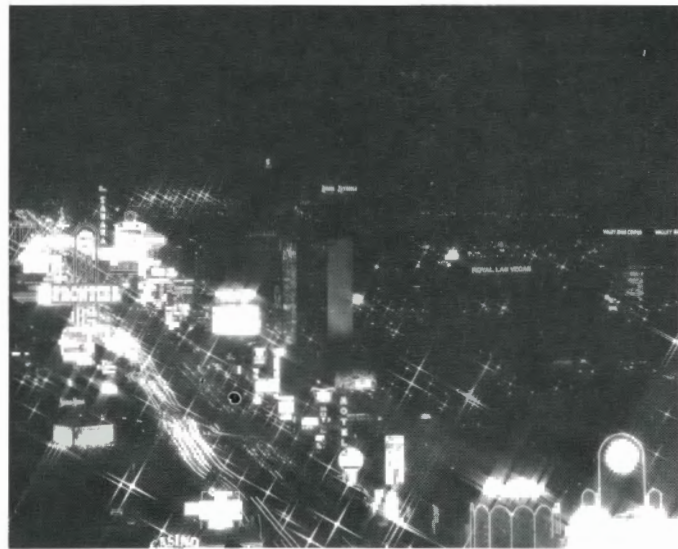
**Atrium and Aviary**—This lush garden and bird sanctuary is located in the lobby of Juanita Greer White Hall. The building is open weekdays.

UNLV operates on a semester system, and is a member of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities, the Council of Graduate Schools in the United States, the Western Association of Graduate Schools, the American Council on Education, and the Western College Association.





## LAS VEGAS, THE CITY



The city of Las Vegas, Nevada is a thriving metropolitan area nestled in a desert valley near the southernmost tip of the state.

Most people know Las Vegas as the Entertainment Capital of the World. But the city has many other attractions.

Like other large cities, Las Vegas has fine libraries, museums, community theatres, art galleries, and parks which are enjoyed and supported by more than 450,000 local residents. As one of the fastest-growing areas in the United States, Southern Nevada is an example of modern urban living for families and individuals.

Mild desert temperatures make outdoor recreation possible throughout the year in Southern Nevada. Within a half-hour's drive from the city lie the shores of Lake Mead, the largest man-made lake in the United States. Local residents enjoy year 'round sailing, water skiing, swimming, and fishing. Massive Hoover Dam and the entire Colorado River recreation area have become a mecca for tourists, boaters, windsurfers, and fishermen.

A short drive north of Las Vegas are the snow-skiing and hiking trails of 12,000-foot Mount Charleston. Year 'round the mountain's cool temperatures, tall pines, ski area, picnicking and camping grounds, and trails are popular with UNLV students, local residents, and visitors.

Other nearby sights abound. Valley of Fire State Park offers a beautiful view of deep red sandstone cliffs, Indian petroglyphs, and desert wildflowers. Red Rock Canyon is

a popular hiking spot and scenic drive. Within a few hours' drive will find Grand Canyon; Death Valley; Zion, Bryce Canyon, and Cedar Breaks national parks; Brianhead and Mount Holly ski resorts; the beaches and amusement parks of Southern California; and the art galleries of Phoenix.

Las Vegas enjoys a mild yearly climate, yet there are noticeable seasonal differences. The annual average temperature is 79 degrees, but it is not unusual for the mercury to hit the 110 degree mark during summer and dip into the 30s in the winter. Annual rainfall amounts to only 3.5 inches, much of it falling in the winter when it is snowing in the nearby mountains.
